

Remarks on board

Friday Apr 1st

This day commences with wind from N. N. E. and pleasant weather course S. by E. N. E. middle and latter parts strong wind from and hazy weather at four A. M. took in the studding sails all hands employed in ships duty

Saturday Mar 2nd

This day commences with light wind from S. W. accompanied with squalls of rain at one P. M. took in the studding sails top gallant sails jib and gaff top sail at four P. M. set the top gallant sails and jib and fore top mast studding sail at five P. M. the wind hauled S. by W. and took in fore top mast studding sail and fore top gallant sail hauled up the courses braced the yards and boarded the starboard tack middle and latter parts calm and light wind from N. N. E. at five A. M. braced around the yards and let fall the courses set the top gallant sails and studding sails course S. by E. at six saw a sail standing to the northward and eastward all hands employed in ships duty Lon by obs $2^{\circ} 15'$ S $51^{\circ} 54'$ by Chrs. Lat $38^{\circ} 17'$ S.

Sunday Apr 3rd

This day commences with moderate wind from N. and pleasant weather at one P. M. unbraced the fore top gallant sail repaired it and at five P. M. set it aloft and set it at six A. M. took in the studding sails and top gallant sails at seven set them again middle and latter parts strong winds from N. by W. and rainy weather all hands employed in ships duty

Sunday Apr 4th

This day commences with strong wind from N. W. and thick weather course E. at two took in the studding sails and top gallant sails at four double reefed the top sails at five P. M. took in the main sail at six P. M. furlled the top sails drove the ship to under fore top mast stay

middle and latter parts strong wind from S. W. and heavy squalls of hail at five A. M. the wind hauled to W. and a sea struck her which parted the martingal and unhooked the dolphin striker at nine A. M. kept the ship of before the wind E. under double reefed top sails and fore sail Lat $38^{\circ} 45'$ S.

Tuesday Apr 5th

This day commences with strong wind from W. and squally weather ship steering E. middle and latter parts moderate wind from the westward and squalls at times at two A. M. shook one reef out the top sails and set the top gallant sails at seven A. M. set the top mast studding sails and main top gallant studding sail all hands employed in felling martingal gages and sending them out Course S. by E. Lat $38^{\circ} 12'$ S.

Wednesday Apr 6th

This day commences with moderate wind from W. and pleasant weather ship steering S. E. at four P. M. altered her course to S. by E. at five P. M. altered it to E. and hauled down the studding sails middle part calm latter part strong wind from S. by E. and thick weather at six A. M. took in the top gallant sails at eight set them again at ten A. M. took them in again all hands employed in ships duty ship steering by the wind with her starboard tack aboard E.

Thursday Apr 7th

This day commences with strong winds from S. E. and squally weather at five P. M. set the top gallant sails and jib middle and latter parts strong winds S. E. and pleasant weather ship steering N. E. at nine P. M. took in the fore top gallant sail at five A. M. set it all hands employed in bracing out for water Lon. by Chrs. $74^{\circ} 12'$ W. Lat. $36^{\circ} 15'$ S.

Friday Apr 8th

This day commences with moderate wind from S. E. and pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading S. by E. at one P. M. set the top gallant sail
