Monday. Apr. 18th Lat. 36° 36' S

This day commences with strong wind from N. N. E. and pleasant weather at four P. M. the wind hauled to W. and clear weather altered our course to E. N. E. middle and latter parts from S. W. and pleasant weather at two A. M. shook reef out the fore topsail main topsail and set the top gallant sails and studding sails at six saw a barque standing to the northward and eastward at eight A. M. the wind hauled to S. W. by S. Course E. N. E. Lon 99° 45' 45" E. Lat 34° 14' S.

Tuesday Apr 19th

This day commences with moderate wind from S. W. by S. and pleasant weather ship steering E. by N. at three A. M. altered our course to E. and took in the studding sails middle and latter parts moderate wind from the South and pleasant weather ship steering East

Wednesday Apr 20th

This day commences with light wind from S. E. and pleasant weather ship by the wind heading N. E. at six P. M. took in sail for the night middle and latter parts light winds from S. E. and pleasant weather ship by the wind heading E. N. E. all hands employed in repairing sails Lon 101° 06' E Lat 32° 28' S

Thursday Apr 21st

This day commences with light wind from N. E. and pleasant weather at six P. M. took in sail middle and latter part light wind from E. and pleasant weather at six A. M. made sail at seven

Barque Elizabeth

A. M. tacked ship and headed S. S. E. all hands employed in bending and unbending sails Lat 32° 32'

Friday Apr 22nd

This day commences with light winds from E. and pleasant weather ship steering S. S. E. middle part light wind from E. S. E. and pleasant weather ship heading S. E. latter part light wind from N. E. and pleasant weather ship heading E. S. E. all hands employed in ships duty Lon 102° 15' E Lat 32° 53' S

Saturday Apr 23rd

This day commences with light wind from N. N. E. and pleasant weather at four P. M. saw a whale tacked ship and headed to the westward at five tacked again and the wind hauled to N. W. squared the yards and steered E. by N. middle part strong wind from N. W. and pleasant weather steering E. at ten P. M. the wind suddenly shifted to S. W. and had a squall of rain clewed up the top gallant outails main sail hauled up and down the jib at eleven P. M. set them again latter part strong wind from south ship steering E. all hands employed in ships duty Lat. 32° 16' S

Sunday Apr 24th

This day commences with moderate wind from S. E. and pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading E. middle part light from E. and and thick weather latter part light winds and calms ship steering by the wind heading N. N. E. at seven A. M. tacked ship and headed S. S. E. at nine wind died away to a calm at eleven A. M. a breeze sprung up from E. ship by the wind heading S. S. E. Lon 104° 45' Lat 31° 30'

Monday Apr 25th

This day commences with light winds from E. and pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading S. S. E. middle and latter parts moderate wind from E. and pleasant weather ship by the wind heading S. S. E. Lat. 32° 34' South
