

Remarks on board

strong wind from E.S.E. and pleasant weather at seven A.M. made sail again and saw a sail ahead and one off lee beam and the hunter off our weather quarter at nine spoke the ship that was ahead which was the Adeline of New Bedford at ten came on board again and luffed the ship on the wind again ship heading N.E. with her starboard tacks aboard Lat 1

Friday May 6th

These twenty-four hours begins with strong winds from E.S.E. and cloudy weather ship by the wind with her starboard tacks aboard at one the ship off our lee beam altered her course to the Southward and westward supposing her to be in pursuit of whale we gave chase at three P.M. she hauled back her main yard for us to speak luffed the ship by the wind and stood on our way at five P.M. shortened sail for the night middle and latter parts strong wind from the Southward and Eastward at six A.M. made sail ship by the wind with her starboard tacks aboard heading to the northward and Eastward Latitude Lat

Saturday May 7th

These twenty-four hours commences with strong wind from the Southward ship by the wind with her starboard tacks aboard at three P.M. took in fly jib and fore top gallant sail tacked ship and stood to the westward at four P.M. took in main top gallant sail tacked ship again at five P.M. shortened sail for the night middle and latter parts strong wind from the Southward & Eastward at six A.M. made sail tacked ship and headed to the Southward and westward Lat Lon

Sunday May 8th

This day commences with strong wind from the Southward and eastward ship by the wind

with her larboard tack aboard heading to the Southward and westward at two P.M. saw a sail off our weather bow at four P.M. she spoke us. proved to be the John Address of New Bedford ten months out 40 lbs sperm 40 lbs whale Capt went on board at eight P.M. came along side and hoisted the boat middle and latter parts strong winds from the Southward and eastward at six A.M. wore ship and headed to the Northward and Eastward moderate gales the remainder of this day so as to allow us to make no more sail ship under fore sail double reefed main top sail Lat

Monday 9th of May

This day commences with moderate gails from the Southward Eastward ship by the wind with her starboard tacks aboard middle part moderate gails from the Southward and eastward at eleven P.M. a vessel passed us steering to the Northward latter part more moderate at six A.M. set fore top sail double reefed at half past six A.M. took reefs out of top sails set the jib and spinnaker at seven set the main sail at eleven raised two sails off our lee beam tack ship and headed South Lat.

Tuesday May 10th

This day commences with moderate wind from the Eastward and pleasant weather at one P.M. set the top gallant sails at two P.M. got the same altitude at six P.M. took in sail for the night middle part moderate wind from the Northward ship by the wind with her larboard tacks aboard latter part light wind from the Westward at six made sail tack ship and headed to the Southward the latter part of this day saw a number of fin back whales Lon. Lat.

Wednesday May 11th

These twenty-four hours commences with light wind from the Westward and pleasant weather
