

Remarks on board

Ship by the wind with her starboard tacks aboard heading to the southward at five P.M. took in sail for the night middle part light wind and calm at twelve wore ship and headed to the westward latter part moderate wind from the southward and pleasant weather at six made sail again at eight squared in the yards and steered her N. W. Lat.

Thursday May 12th

This day commences with moderate wind from southward and eastward at one P.M. altered her course to N. at two P.M. got the suns altitude at five shortened sail for the night kept the ship by the wind heading to the southward and westward middle part wind from the southward and eastward with squally weather at half past five A.M. set the topsails and jib at six A.M. wore ship and steered her N. E. the latter part strong wind from the southward and eastward with cloudy weather altered the ships course at seven A.M. from N. E. to N. by E. at eight A.M. E. at nine N. by E. at ten N. at eleven N. W. at twelve N. W. Lat.

Friday May 13th

Thursday commences with strong wind from the southward and cloudy weather at two P.M. altered the ships course to N. E. at five P.M. took in sail as usual middle part strong wind from the southward and pleasant weather at six A.M. made sail again at seven kept her N. E. at eight altered her course to N. W. E. at nine raised a sail off our weather-beam at half past nine kept the ship of N. at ten got the suns altitude and kept the ship N. W. at eleven N. W. at twelve altered her course to N. E. Lat.

These twenty-four hours commences with moderate wind from the southward and pleasant weather at five shortened sail for the night and kept the ship by the wind heading to the eastward middle part light wind from the southward and pleasant weather at six A.M. made sail and kept the ship off steering several courses the latter part of this day at twelve ship headed N. W. Lat.

Sunday May 15th

This day commences with light winds and calm the weather clear and pleasant at two got a lunar obs. lowered the boat this afternoon for exercise at five P.M. shortened sail for the night middle part light winds and calms latter part strong wind from Northward and Westward at six A.M. made sail three sails seen from aloft run down and spoke one of our ^{old} bow (Arab of New Bedford) twenty-four months out 1000 whale 400 Spinn Len Lat.

Monday May 16th

These twenty-four hours commences with strong winds from the northward and westward squally and rainy weather ship by the wind in company with the Arab heading Northward and eastward at five took in sail for the night middle part wind from the Westward squally weather and rainy latter part wind from southward and eastward squally and rainy weather at six A.M. set the topsails and jib two sails in sight ship by the wind with her ^{and tacks} ^{aboard} Lat.

These twenty-four hours commences with strong wind from the southward and rainy weather at two P.M. spoke barque Lexington Providence five months out clean at half past two took in fore topsail and doubled reefed the main ship by
