

Remarks on board

at five P.M. spoke the Anne Bristol 8 months out 100 lbs sperm at six P.M. took in sail for the night middle part moderate wind from the eastward and pleasant weather ship by the wind with her larboard tacks aboard at six A.M. made sail wore ship and stood to the northward Lat

Tuesday May 24th

This day commences with strong wind from the eastward and cloudy weather the first part of this day tacked ship frequently to speak the colline which was to the windward of us at eight P.M. spoke her and took in sail for the night ship heading to northward middle part strong wind from the eastward and hazy weather at six A.M. made sail (double reefed topsails) latter and steered N. ends these twenty four hours Lat

Wednesday May 25th

This day commences with strong wind from the northward and eastward weather cloudy at two P.M. luffed the ship by the wind with her larboard tacks aboard middle part light wind from the northward and westward with heavy rain at six A.M. made sail again at eight A.M. wind hauled to be southward and eastward braced around the yards and headed to the northward and eastward Lat

Thursday May 26th

This day commences with light wind from southward and westward at one P.M. steered the ship east at two got an altitude at three luffed the ship by the wind at four P.M. tacked ship at six P.M. shortened sail for the night ship by the wind with her larboard tacks aboard at eight spoke the Delphus Fishery 11 months out 850 whale 150 sperm middle part light wind from the northward

and westward at six A.M. made sail latter part wind from southward ship steering to the eastward Lat

Friday May 27th

This day commences with light wind from the southward and pleasant weather at six P.M. shortened sail for the night at seven P.M. spoke the Condor New Bedford 8 months out 800 whale 40 sperm middle part light wind from the eastward and pleasant weather at six A.M. made sail and at seven A.M. raised sperm whales board the boats chased but did not take any

Saturday May 28th

This day commences with light wind from the northward and eastward clear and pleasant weather at four P.M. boats came on board and spoke the Victor Roughkeepsie 8 mo. out 200th 200 wh took in sail for the night middle and latter part light wind from the southward and eastward clear and pleasant weather at six made sail again and kept the ship by the wind with her starboard tacks aboard Lat

Sunday May 29th

This day commences with moderate wind from the northward and eastward pleasant weather at four P.M. (made sail as) tacked ship and headed to the eastward at six shortened sail for the night middle and later part moderate wind from the eastward at six A.M. made sail at seven tacked ship and headed to the northward at nine got a lunar Lat

Monday May 30th

This day commences with light winds and calms the weather clear and pleasant at five P.M. shortened sail for the night middle part light winds and calms weather hazy ship by the wind with her starboard tacks aboard at six
