

Remarks on board

Monday Sept 5th

This day commences with light wind from the eastward and pleasant weather at three P.M. got an altitude middle part wind hauled to the northward latter part strong breeze. Course S. Lat

Tuesday Sept 6th

This day commences with wind from the northward and boisterous weather at three P.M. got an altitude at four doubled reefed topsails latter part more moderate with a southerly wind. Lat.

Wednesday Sept 7th

This day commences with a light southerly wind and pleasant weather middle and latter parts a southerly wind and fine weather ship by the wind heading S. E. Lat.

Thursday Sept 8th

There twenty-four hours light wind from the southward and fine weather middle and latter parts light wind from the southeast ship by the wind with her starboard tack aboard. Lat.

Friday Sept 9th

This day commences with light wind from the southward and eastward and fine weather at three got an altitude middle and latter parts light variable winds. Lat.

Saturday Sept 10th

This day commences with a light wind from the northward and increased to a gale from the westward middle part ship now heading to the southward under spinnaker latter part more moderate with a southerly wind at eight tacked ship and headed to the southward and westward. Lat.

Sunday Sept 11th

This day commences with a strong S. easterly wind and cloudy weather middle and latter parts more moderate with a westerly wind. Course S. Lat

Monday Sept 12th

This day commences with a westerly gale at eight P.M. bore ship to middle and latter parts squally with westerly gales ship heading to the southward. Lat

Tuesday Sept 13th

There twenty-four hours moderate gales from the westward and squally weather ship heading to the southward. Lat.

Wednesday Sept 14th

This day moderate winds from the southward and westward with cloudy weather ship steering to the southward.

Thursday Sept 15th

This day a moderate breeze from the westward and cloudy weather ship steering a Course S. W. Lat

Friday Sept 16th

This day moderate gales from the westward and squally weather ship steering to the southward at three P.M. got an altitude at seven A.M. spoke the Pandora New Bedford 1300 lbs and Jefferson Wilmington 1300 lbs. Lat

Saturday Sept 17th

There twenty-four hours strong gales from the westward and squally weather at ten P.M. bore ship and headed to the northward and westward. Lat

Sunday Sept 18th

This day light huffing wind and pleasant weather shortened sail for the night. Lat.
