Monday Sept 19th

The first part of this day moderate wind from the northward and pleasant weather middle and latter wind from the northward and wind and squally weather at ten spoke the Jefferson Wilmington

Sept 20th

This day a moderate breeze from the northward and pleasant weather ship in company of the Jefferson steering to the southward and W. Lat.

Wednesday Sept 21st

This day commenced with heavy weather at eight P.M. commenced a gale from the northward at nine A.M. wind suddenly hauled to S.W. striking ship aback without doing any material damage Lat.

Thursday Sept 22nd

This day moderate gales from the westward and squally weather ship bore to under close reefed main top sail according to the weather Lat.

Friday Sept 23rd

There were twenty-four hours moderate gales from the westward and squally weather of ship under close reefed top sail heading to the southward Lat.

Saturday Sept 24th

This day strong wind from the W. and squally weather at three P.M. got up altitude

Sunday Sept 25th

This day moderate wind from the westward and pleasant ship under double reefed top sails heading S.

Monday Sept 26th

This day moderate gales from the westward and squally rainy first part ship heading S. latter part course S.E.

Tuesday Sept 27th

There were twenty-four hours moderate gales from the westward and squally weather ship course S.E. first part latter part S.

Wednesday Sept 28th

This day moderate wind from the West. and pleasant weather ship steering a course S.E.

Thursday Sept 29th

This day moderate wind from the westward and pleasant weather ship course S.E. first part S. the latter part Lat.

Friday Sept 30th

This day strong wind from the westward and light squalls of rain ship course S. Lat.

Saturday Oct 1st

Moderate wind from the southward and westward at seven o'clock a night gale lowered the boats and the starboard boat got fast and dragged at nine starboard and work boat got fast

Sunday Oct 2nd

This day moderate wind from the westward and cloudy weather at four P.M. got the whales along side at eight o'clock got loose latter part all hands employed in cutting the other rope in so ends these twenty-four hours
