Friday Oct. 29th

This day commences with a light breeze from the northward middle part wind shifted to the westward with heavy rain latter part moderate weather ship steering to the Westward

Saturday Oct 30th

This day commences with a fine breeze from the westward and pleasant weather at seven night whales lowered the boats but did not strike middle and latter part a moderate gale from W.

Sunday Oct 31st

This day moderate wind from the Westward and pleasant weather at four spoke the Spina her London & me out 1800

Monday Nov 1st

This day heavy gale of wind and squally weather ship hove to with her starboard tacks aboard heading to the S.W.

Tuesday Oct 2nd

This day a gale of wind from the westward and heavy squalls of wind and rain at six P.M. were ship

Wednesday Nov 3rd

This day more moderate a strong wind from the westward and pleasant weather kept the ship off S.E.

Friday Nov 5th

This day a moderate breeze from the north westward and pleasant weather at six P.M. raised a sail off our weather beam Course this day S.W.

Saturday Nov 6th

This day a fine breeze from the westward & pleasant weather Course S.E.

Barque Cinabath

Sunday Nov 6th

This day strong wind from the westward & pleasant weather at seven P.M. shortened sail for the night at ten they passed and English brig standing to the northward ship turning off for most of the day

Monday Nov 7th

This day light baffling winds and calm ship working to the eastward raised two sails to the landward

Tuesday Nov 9th 1842

This day a strong breeze from the S.W. and cloudy weather at five P.M. lowered the boats for a right whale but did not get fast
