

Bark Elizabeth on a Whaling Voyage in 1845  
Remarks on Board Monday August the 18<sup>th</sup> 1845  
These 24 hours Commence with very pleasant weather the Bark  
heading to the ESE at 3 P.M. saw a sail to the Westward  
standing to the NW at 4 P.M. saw a brig to the NE standing  
to the North supposed to be a whalman at sunset took in  
the light sails middle part wore ship to the Eastward day  
light fine weather latter part employed in regulating the  
Main hold so Lat 17° 30' Long 3° 40' west

Tuesday August the 19<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Light winds from the SE Commences with a  
and the bark heading to the Westward and one sail  
in sight steering to the SW. supposed to be a  
whalman and several fine and hump backs at  
sunset shortened sail for the night middle part fore  
weather the bark heading to the SW latter part more  
moderate made off sail daylight set whole top  
sails one sail in sight latter part employ  
ed in stowing off the main hold  
Lat by obs 17° 28' Long by Cr 2° 48' west

Monday August the 20<sup>th</sup>  
strong trades the bark Commences with  
heading to the ESE at 4 P.M. wore ship at sunset  
shortened sail for the night at 11 mid night saw  
a sail to the SE under single reef top sails  
supposed to be a whalman at 6 AM wore ship

Wednesday August the 20<sup>th</sup> 1845

Commences with strong  
winds from the ESE and the bark heading to the ESE  
at 4 P.M. wore ship to the Westward at sunset shortened  
sail for the night at 11 P.M. saw a sail to the SE stand  
ing to the Westward under single reef top sails supposed to  
be a whalman at sunrise wore ship to the Eastward  
few finbacks and humpbacks Latitude by observation 17° 15'

Thursday August the 21<sup>st</sup>

Commences with strong  
trades the bark heading to the Eastward at 5 P.M. wore ship to  
the Westward saw one or two finbacks middle part strong  
winds and the bark heading to the Westward at daylight kept  
her off to the Northward and Westward employed in setting  
up Coaks at meridian steered off 8° 58' Latitude by obs 17° 45' Long

Friday August the 22<sup>nd</sup> 1845

Commences with  
strong winds from the SE and the bark heading to the  
SE at sunset luffed to the wind and shortened sail  
for the night the bark heading SE daylight made  
short sail at 6 A.M. kept off 8° 58' W saw several finbacks  
at meridian luffed up North

Latitude by observation 17° 15'  
Longitude by Cr was 4° 45' west
