Remarks on Board Thursday September the 11th 1845
these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the south and
the Bark steering West under all sail Middle part fresh gales
from the Southward and the Bark heading to the Westward under all
sail the crew employed in taring the fore and main rigging latter
part much the same saw nothing more than 4 or 5 finfish So ends
Latitude by obsⁿ 16°50' South Longitude by Chron^r 23°35' west

Remarks on Board September Friday the 12th 1845
These 24 hours commence with brisk breeze from the South the
Bark steering West under all sail saw nothing this part latter part
light winds from the Southward and the Bark heading W by N
under all sail Middle part light winds from the South
and the Bark heading the same So ends these 24 hours Latⁿ 16°45' Longth 23°50'

Remarks on Board Saturday September the 13th
These 24 hours commence with a light air from the South
And the Bark heading West under all sail Middle
part and latter much the same So ends Latⁿ 16°44' Longth 27°48'

REMARKS ON BOARD SUNDAY SEPTEMBER THE 14TH 1845

these 24 hours commence with light winds from the Southward and the Bark heading W by N saw a number of
finbacks Middle part light air and pleasant weather the Bark steering W by N latter part
fresh gales from the N E and the Bark steering West under
all sail saw nothing of note so ends
Latitude by obsⁿ 17°24' South Longitude by Chron^r 29°26'

Bound To The Abrolhos Banks in the year 1800 and 45
REMARKS ON BOARD MONDAY ~~SEPTEMBER~~ THE 15TH 1845

these 24 hours commence with light winds and pleasant
weather the Bark heading West under all sail at 3 P M
saw a sail to the N E steering to the Southward called a merchant
ship saw several finbacks Middle part and latter much the same
Latitude by obsⁿ 17°50' Longth by Chron^r 31°19' ^{wrong} take notice

Remarks on Board September Tuesday the 16th 1845
these 24 hours commence with light winds from the
N E and the Bark heading W under all sail
Middle part light winds from the N E and the Bark
heading W by S under all sail latter part much the
same So ends these 24 hours Latⁿ by obs 18°17' Longth 40°32' 44'

Remarks on Board Monday September the 17th 1845
these 24 hours commence with light airs and baffling the
Bark steering W by S under all sail saw 1 or two finfish
Middle part and latter much the same So ends no lat no

Remarks on Board Tuesday September the 18th in 1845
these 24 hours commence with pleasant weather and no wind
the Bark steering W by East at 4 P M saw a shoal of ~~Porpoise~~ Porpoise
caught one and the other escaped unhurt latter part the same So ends these
24 hours Latitude by obsⁿ 18°30' South
