

Bark Elizabeth Cruising on The Abrolhos Banks in 1845  
Remarks on Board Tuesday September the 24<sup>th</sup> 1845  
these 24 hours begin with brisk breezes from the  
South and the Bark heading N<sup>W</sup> under all sail  
Saw this day 4 or 5 Sails Middle part saw 3 or 4  
Sails latter part much the same so ends <sup>Lat Long</sup> 19° 11' 36" 75'

Remarks on board Wednesday September the 25<sup>th</sup> 1845  
these 24 hours begin with fresh breezes from the NE  
and the Bark heading S<sup>W</sup> under all sail saw a  
large school of Black fish within 1 ships length  
of us so ends saw 2

REMARKS ON BOARD Thursday Sep 26<sup>th</sup>  
these 24 hours begin with fresh winds from the  
NE and the Bark heading South under all sail with  
2 sails in sight Middle and latter part the same

REMARKS ON BOARD Sep the 27<sup>th</sup> 1845  
these 24 Commence with fresh gales from the  
Northward and the Bark steering S<sup>W</sup>  
under all sail saw a shoal of Blackfish and  
supposed Middle part fresh breezes from the North  
and the Bark heading the same so ends  
Lat 22° 10' Long 36° 51'

Bounded for the River de Antioquia in 1845  
Remarks on Board Friday the 28<sup>th</sup> 1845  
these 24 hours begin with fresh gales from the Northward  
and misty weather the Bark steering S<sup>W</sup> under all sail  
Some employed in setting up the main top gallant rigging at 2  
P. M. saw an English Brig steering to the NE middle part at mid  
night the Bark steering from South to S<sup>W</sup> at 12 midnight  
double reefed the topsails daylight made all sail the Bark head  
ing S by E at meridian tacked to the West so ends these 24 hours

REMARKS ON BOARD Saturday September the 29<sup>th</sup>  
these 24 Commence with fresh gales from the NE and the Bark  
heading West under all sail at 1 P. M. saw a large Brig steering  
to the NE supposed to be a merchantman at sunset close  
reefed the topsails and furled the main course Middle part  
and latter much the same so ends these 24 hours no latitude

Remarks on Board Sunday September the 28<sup>th</sup>  
these 24 hours Commence with strong winds  
S<sup>W</sup> and the Bark heading to the Southward under  
double reefed topsails saw 1 Sail steering to the NE  
Middle and latter part winds the same and the Bark  
heading W by S under double reefed topsails so  
ends these 24 hours latitude 24° 17' Long 38° 37'
