

Remarks on Board Saturday November the 1st 1845
these 24 hours commence with fresh breezes from the SE and the bark
to the Westward under whole topsails still a boiling saw a number
of finbacks at sunset shortened sail the night and wore ship to
the ENE middle part cloudy weather and rain the bark
heading the same at daylight cloudy and some rain
wore ship to the West saw 1 finback at 1 midnight
finished boiling at 8 AM the wind hauled to the NNE
the bark heading NW so ends these 24 hours no lat no long

Remarks on Board Sunday November the 2nd
these 24 hours commence with fresh gales and cloudy the wind
NNE the bark heading S by E under double reefed maintop
sail and forecourse at 6 PM wore ship to the SSE the
weather much the same middle and latter part Moderate
the bark heading the same so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Monday November the 3rd
these 24 hours commence with thick fog and a heavy swell
the bark heading ENE under double reefed maintop sail
at 8 AM the wind hauled suddenly to the South and
blew a gale the bark heading S by E took in the
maintop sail it blowing a screamer so ends these 24
hours latitude 37° 00' longitude 47° 46'

Exising of the Reiger de la Platte in 1845—
Remarks on Board Tuesday November the 4th
these 24 hours commence with a gale of wind from the
South the bark heading S by E at 4 PM set close reef
maintop sail the weather debating at 5-6 PM kept
her N East at 12 midnight the wind hauled to the Eastward
the bark heading N by E at 8 AM set whole topsails saw
a number of finbacks and Porpoises so ends these 24 hours
Latitude 36° 58' Longitude 48° 02'

Remarks on Board Wednesday November the 5th
these 24 hours begin with very fine weather the wind from the East
the bark heading SE under whole topsails at sunset shortened
sail for the night the bark heading N by E at daylight took in
the bark heading SE at 8 AM saw a sail steering to the west
supposed to be an English Merchantman at meridian short-
ened sail under double reefed topsails at meridian
wore ship to the South so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on Board Thursday November the 6th
these 24 hours begin with fresh gales from the SE and the
bark heading South at sunset shortened sail for the
night as usual at daylight made all sail the bark hea-
ding S by E saw a number of finbacks & porpoises
nothing more of note so ends these 24 hours
Latitude by observation 35° 34'
Longitude 45° 34'
