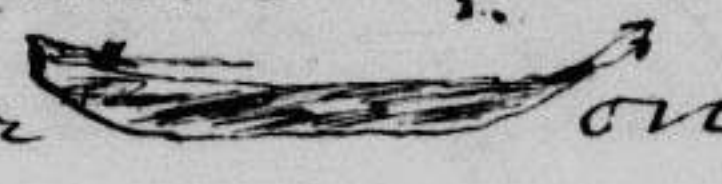


Remarks on Board Thursday November the 13th
 these 24 hours commence with a fresh gale and cloudy weather the
 Barks heading N by E under a double reefed main topsail &
 fore course saw a number of Killers Middle part rainy and a
 fresh breeze from ENE at 10 A.M. set double reefed topsails & fore
 course & ends their 24 hours Latitude by obs $36^{\circ}36'$ Long $48^{\circ}11'$

Remarks on Board Friday November the 14th
 these 24 hours commence with fresh breeze from the East &
 the Barks heading NE under double reefed topsails & fore
 course at 4 past 3 P.M. saw something called him a right
 whale but gave him up for an humpback at 6 P.M.
 saw the same supposed fish and made him an right whale
 lowered the two larboard boats and the waist boat got
 within two shots of him darted and then started for
 the windward. Middle part foggy the Barks heading SE latter
 part much the same saw a number of finbacks
 Lat $36^{\circ}09'$ Long $48^{\circ}25'$

Remarks on Board Saturday November the 15th
 these 24 hours commence with light airs and foggy
 the Barks heading SE at 5 P.M. saw a right whale
 lowered the 2 larboard boats without success
 Middle part and latter much the same the
 Barks heading SE saw a number of finbacks
 Lat $36^{\circ}14'$ Long $48^{\circ}20'$

Remarks on Board Sunday November the 16th 1845
 these 24 hours commence with pleasant weather the barks
 $35^{\circ}31\frac{1}{2}'$ steering SE the wind from the NNE several finbacks
 in sight Middle part thick latter part mild several
 finbacks in sight at meridian steered ENE wind
 from the West Lat $36^{\circ}48'$ Long $47^{\circ}46'$

Remarks on Board Monday November the 17th
 $35^{\circ}41\frac{1}{2}'$ these 24 hours commence with pleasant weather
 the Barks steering ENE the water blue at 6 P.M.
 shortened sail for the night Middle part calm
 daylight calm saw a right whale close to the ship
 going quick lowered all 3 boats without success at 9
 A.M. came on board took a breeze from the ESE and
 steered to the NE for the others got a new boat
 down to fit put her  on the larboard crew
 Lat $36^{\circ}54'$ Long

Remarks on Board Tuesday November the 18th
 these 24 hours commence with strong winds
 from the East at 6 P.M. shortened sail with a
 gale latter part thick & rainy & ends
