

Remarks on Board Sunday Dec 14th 1845
 these 24 hours commence with pleasant weather
 the Bark steering west under all sail the water
 thick at meridian wind hauled to the N^W saw a
 large piece of squid and a number of finbacks and
 porpoises the water green so ends Lat 39°55' Long 50°03'

Remarks on Board Monday December the 15th
 these 24 hours commence with a calm at 3 a light
 breeze from the N^W the bark heading S^W by W
 a number of finbacks and porpoises in sight middle
 part a fresh breeze from the N^W and the bark heading
 West latter part much the same stowed down 63 barrels of
 sperm oil at 10 A M saw a brig ^{and} a bark both steering to the
 North saw a number of finbacks & porpoises ground very
 lively so ends these 24 hours Lat 39°55' Long 51°26'

Remarks on Board Tuesday December the 16th 1845
 these 24 hours commence with fine pleasant weather the bark heading
 West under all sail with 2 sails in sight both bound North
 saw everything like whales and to get one soon at sunset took
 in sail for the night middle part light breezes from the
 N^W and the bark heading S^W by W at daylight
 a fresh gale from the N^W and the bark heading
 S^W by W took in the foretop sail at 10 set it again
 the weather decreasing so ends these 24 hours
 Latitude 40°04' Longitude 52°05'

1845
 Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec the 17th
 these 24 hours commence with light gales from the N^W by W
 and the bark heading North under whole topsails and
 forecourse the weather decreasing at sunset close reefed the
 topsails the bark heading North at 12 midnight wore ship
 to the S^W latter part much the same at 12 meridian wore
 ship to the North so ends Lat 39°44' Longitude 52°16'

1845
 Remarks on Board Thursday Dec the 18th
 these 24 hours commence with brisk gales from the N^W by W
 and the Bark heading North under double reefed topsails at
 sunset took in the foretop sail and main course middle
 part at 12 P M wore ship to the N^W by W at daylight steered
 off S^W by W with light gales at meridian steered off or buffed up
 N^W saw nothing so ends Lat 39°10' Long 51°06'

1845
 Remarks on Board Friday Dec the 19th
 these 24 hours commence with light gales from the N^W by W
 and the Bark heading N^W under double reefed topsail
 and forecourse at sunset took in the foretop sail and fore
 course the Bark heading to the Westward at 7 A M
 set the foresail and double reefed foretop sail at 10 A M
 a gale with light showers of rain here too under a double
 reefed main topsail so ends Lat Long 51°32'
