 these 24 hours commenced with a fresh breeze from the West
 and the bark heading to the N.E. saw a number of finbacks
 and porpoises came for the night at 12 midnight a gale
 from the West with thunder and lightning took in the
 foresail and close reefed the main topsail with some rain
 latter part rainy with some hail set the foresail at meridian
 wore ship to the Southward so ends Lat 40°24' Long 48°40'2"

 these 24 hours commenced with fine weather the bark
 heading to the S.W. under double topsails saw a
 number of finbacks and few porpoises at sunset
 shortened sail for the night and left to the wind
 to the S.W. wind to the S.E. Daylight made
 sail and stood to the S.E. wind to N.E. at 5 A.M.
 tack ship to the North latter part shortened sail
 with fresh gails from the N.E. and Cloudy

Remarks on Board Sunday Jan^{uary} the 4th
 these 24 hours commenced with a gale from the
 N.E. and the bark heading N.W. sunset
 brisk gales from the N.E. and Cloudy the bark
 heading to the Northward under her Storm Sails
 at daylight set whole topsails the bark heading N.E.
 at meridian luffed up N.E. saw 1 finback and an number
 of porpoises so ends Lat 40°08' Long 48°44'

Remarks on Board Monday Jan^{uary} the 5th
 these 24 hours commenced with fresh gails from the S.W.
 the bark heading N.E. under forecourse and double reef
 main topsail saw a number of porpoises and a piece of
 squid and 1 sunfish at sunset shortened sail for the
 night the night the bark heading to the N.W. at 2
 A.M. hauled up the forecourse it blowing a gale from
 the N.W. at 5 A.M. close reefed the main topsails with
 showers of rain so ends Latitude 39°19' Longitude 46°28'

Remarks on Board Tuesday Jan^{uary} the 6th
 these 24 hours commenced with a gale from the N.W.
 and the bark heading N.E. under a close reef main
 topsail with showers of rain at 9 P.M. the wind hauled
 to the South the bark heading to the N.W. latter part
 much the same so ends Latitude 38°40' Longitude 46°22'

Remarks on Board Wednesday Jan^{uary} the 7th
 these 24 hours commenced with a gale from the South and the
 bark heading to the N.W. under a close reef main
 topsail at daylight set whole topsails the S.W. at 10 A.M.
 double reefed the main topsail and took in the
 mainsail at 11 A.M. took in the foretopsail
 Saw 1 sail so ends
