

Remarks ON Board Tuesday Jan the 13th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the NE the bark heading S by West under whole topsails and forecourse saw a number of Porpoises at sunset took in sail as usual at daylight ^{double reefed} took whole topsails heading to the South at 10 A.M. unbent the foresail to repair saw a number of Porpoises so ends
 Latitude 38° 03' Longitude 48° 02'

Remarks ON Board Wednesday Jan the 14th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the ESE and the bark heading NE under double reefed topsails and courses saw a number of Porpoises squid and jumbo at sunset shortened sail for the night at daylight ^{double reefed} took whole topsails and courses at 7 A.M. unbent the main course to repair the bark heading to the NE saw 1 sunfish nothing more of note so ends
 Latitude 38° 27' Longitude 47° 30'

Remarks ON Board Thursday Jan the 15th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the ESE and the bark heading to the NE under double reefed topsails the workmen employed in mending the main course saw nothing at sunset took in sail at daylight the wind from the NE the bark heading to the East at the foresail wind increasing at 11 took in the foresail work ship to the N by E close reefed main top lat 38° 12' Long 48°

 Remarks ON Board Friday Jan the 16th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the NNE and the bark standing to the S by W under her storm sails at 4 P.M. blowing fresh with rain middle part the wind hauling to the Westward day light a gale from the "N by W" the bark standing to the S by W so ends Latitude 38° 04' Longitude 48° 55'

Remarks ON Board Saturday Jan the 17th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the "N by W" and the bark standing to the Southward at 3 P.M. wore ship to the S by W the wind abating daylight a strong breeze and cloudy
 SO ENDS

 Remarks ON Board Sunday Jan the 18th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with light winds and cloudy the bark heading to the S by W under all prudent sail at sunset shortened sail for the night middle part a calm daylight light winds from the S by E with some rain the bark heading S by W at 8 A.M. saw a bark to the South steering NE at 10 A.M. spoke the bark Simon of New Bedford 7 months out 80 barrels sperm Latitude 37° 40' Longitude 49° 20'

Remarks ON Board Monday Jan the 19th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with thick weather and squally at 3 P.M. spoke the "W. Thompson" of New Bedford 35 months out 4300 bound bark at sunset shortened sail for night the weather squally middle part much the same daylight light air latter part pleasant ^{double reefed} took whole topsails so ends
 Lat 37° 45' Long 50° 09'
