 to the South at 9 A.M. spoke the bark "William Ann of Seattle"
 11 months out bound to the coast of Patagonia So ends
 Latitude $38^{\circ}40'$ Long. $50^{\circ}19'$

 these 24 hours commence with fine pleasant gales from
 the North and the bark heading to the 78° of 78° under all
 sail at 8 A.M. saw a brig 1 point of the weather quarter tack
 ship and stood for her at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 11 A.M. spoke the said
 brig it proved the Catherine Wood of Westport Currier
 master 3 months out Which afforded us some news and
 Latitude $39^{\circ}04'$ Longitude $48^{\circ}55'$ west
 Catherine Wood

Remarks on Board ~~Saturday~~ Sunday Jan^{ry} the 25th 1846
 these 24 hours commence with fine pleasant weather the
 bark heading to the NE still in company with the
 aforesaid brig at 6 P.M. shortened sail for the night at
 9 P.M. parted company at daylight made all sail
 the bark heading to the SE the brig in sight
 saw a number of Halibuts porpoises and gramp
 So ends these 24 hours
