these 24 hours commence with strong winds and cloudy
at 2 P.M. we ship to the Eastward still jamming with
the Solon at 3 P.M. parted company at 6 P.M. Shortened
sail for the night the weather bidding for a gale day-
light fresh gales and squally the Solon still in sight saw
nothing of note so ends Latitude 41° 09' Longitude 54° 20'

Remarks ON Board ^{my} Feb the 2nd
these 24 hours commence with strong winds &
cloudy the Solon in sight at 6 P.M. Shortened sail for
the night at daylight the Solon in sight of the
lea beam saw nothing of note so ends Lat 41° 12' Long 54° 30'

Remarks ON Board ^{my} Feb the 3rd
these 24 hours commence with fresh gales the bark
heading to the Westward under her storm sails the brig
still in sight at 5 P.M. we ship to the Eastward at
daylight more moderate but all prudent sail the brig
in sight at 8 A.M. lost sight of the brig so ends

Wednesday Feb the 4th commences with a strong breeze
from the S.W. and the bark standing to the E.S.E. under
short sail at sunset shortened sail as usual daylight sat
all prudent sail the bark heading to East at 8 A.M. saw
a bark to the East steering N.W. supposed bound home at 10
tacked ship to the west let one reef out of the topsail
set the main course Lat 42° 12' Long 52° 00'

Remarks ON Board ^{my} Thursday Feb the 5th
these 24 hours commence with light winds from the S.W.
and the bark standing to the West at sunset shortened sail
for night the weather looking thick daylight a fresh breeze from
the S.W. the bark standing to the West saw a sail off the lea
beam steering to the Northward and Eastward supposed to be
homeward bound at 10 A.M. kept the bark of North
Lat 41° 59' Long

Remarks ON Board ^{my} Friday February the 6th
these 24 hours commence with pleasant gales from the South
the bark steering N.E. or N. by East at sunset a calm
shortened sail for the night middle part a calm daylight
a light breeze from the North set all sail put an old boat
on the larboard cranes Lat 41° 34' Long 51° 34' west

Saturday Feb the 7th commences with a fresh
breeze from the N.N.W. and the bark standing to the N.E.
at 3 P.M. blowing fresh hove her to under her storm
sails middle and latter part much the same the bark
heading to the North so ends Lat 41° 30' Long 51° 00'
