REMARKS ON BOARD SUNDAY FEBRUARY THE 9th
these 24 hours commence with with fresh breezes from the West and the bark standing to the North at 10 AM saw an american whaler of our sea beam supposed to be outward bound at 2 PM more moderate sat the foresail at daylight sat whole topsails the wind from the W S W at 6 AM steered of N by E latter part the wind increasing at meridian steered off N E by E Lat 48° 31' Lon 51° 10'

REMARKS ON BOARD Monday Feb the 10th 1846
these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the West the bark steering N E by E at 1 PM huffed to the wind in the W S W the wind from the S W put the bark under her storm sails and hoisted her to middle part the same latter part wore ship to the South Lat 40° 00' Long

REMARKS ON BOARD Wednesday Feb the 11th 1846
these 24 hours commence with a gale from the W S W the bark lying under her storm sails at 1 PM the ship ARAB of fairhaven passed within a short distance so as to give us a chance to read her name at sunset wore ship daylight moderate at 1 PM steered of N by E Lat 39° 23' Long 50° 25'

REMARKS ON BOARD Thursday Feb the 12th
these 24 hours commence with fresh breezes and cloudy the bark steering N by E at 2 PM steered N N E at sunset shortened sail for the night the bark heading to the Eastward at daylight made all sail with a calm saw a number of alabaster coars saw nothing of note so ends with a calm Lat 38° 51' Long

REMARKS ON BOARD Friday Feb the 13th 1846
these 24 hours commence with a calm the bark heading noway and always at 3 PM took a breeze from the East the bark standing to the S E saw 1 turtle at sunset shortened sail for the night daylight light winds from the South and the bark heading N E under double reefed topsails and courses saw sails and a number of porpoises saw nothing more of note so ends Lat 39° 07' Lon 48° 57'

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REMARKS ON BOARD SATURDAY FEBRUARY THE 14th
these 24 hours commence with brisk breezes and squally at 2 PM close reefed the topsails and 2 sails in sight at 5 PM spoke the Bargu yeoman of Plymouth too-ding 7 masts the out 300 spars at sunset parted company and shortened sail for the night at daylight brisk breezes and 2 sails in sight set whole topsails at 10 AM spoke the Brk Lebaron of new port spars 16 masts the out 300 spars at sunset Lat Lon
