Remarks on Board Tuesday Feb ^{17th} the 17th
these 24 hours commence with a gale the bark lying to
under her storm sails at sunset and running fast much the
same saw nothing so ends Lat 38° 50' Long 47° 11'

Remarks on Board Wednesday Feb the 18th
these 24 hours commence with a gale at 1 P.M. set the foresail
saw a sail of the Lee beam kept the ship for hat 5
P.M. spoke the Bark Dove of New London 20 months
out 700 ^{bls} sunset shortened sail and luffed to the
West daylight steered of N by W

at 10 A.M. saw a sail the H^W at 11 spoke the
Bark Cachelot of Mattapoisett Taber 9½ months
out 600 ^{bls} 100 ^{right} whale oil at sunset parted company and short-
ened sail for the night so ends Lat 37° 00'

Remarks on Board Thursday Feb 19th
these 24 hours commence with fresh gales from the South
and the bark standing to the SE at 4 P.M. wore ship to the
Westward in company with the Cachelot daylight fine
pleasant weather made all sail and stood to the S^W
the Cachelot in sight so ends Lat 37° 12'

Remarks on Board Friday Feb 20th 1846
these 24 hours light baffling winds the bark standing
to the S^W sunset shortened sail as usual daylight
pleasant weather sat all sail at 6 P.M. steered of S^W by W
the Cachelot in sight Lat 37° 50' Long 48° 27'

Saturday Feb ^{21st} the 21st Commences with light winds from
the North the bark steering S^W by W under all sail the Cachelot
in sight at 1 P.M. saw a sail to the S^W at 4 P.M. saw her speak
the bark Cachelot hauled up and ran for them at 7 P.M. spoke
the Brig Pega of Wareham Goodworth 11 months out 500 sperm
at 12 mid^{night} luffed to the wind to the West daylight light airs
and cloudy at 7 A.M. steered of S by W at 9 A.M. luffed to the wind to the
Eastward at 10 A.M. saw 2 sails one to the windward and the
other to the leeward Lat 38° 50' Long 48° 40'
