

Tuesday March the 17th 1846

commences with fresh breezes from the N^W the bark heading the S^W at 4 P.M. finished stowing down at sunset were shifted to the West midnight took in jib foretop sail and main course it blowing fresh daylight more moderate at 8 P.M. made all sail the bark heading to the West saw nothing of note so ends Lat ^{38° 15'} Long 45° 21'

Wednesday March the 18th commences with fine hazy weather at 4 P.M. tacked ship the N^W 8th middle part fresh gales and squally at 12 mid^{night} took in the main slop gallant sail and jib at 5 A.M. double reefed the foretop sail at 6 P.M. hauled up the mainsail at 7 close reefed the main topsail at 11 A.M. took in the foretop sail and hove to under her storm sails at 1 P.M. saw a sail steering to the South at 2 A.M. we wore to the South so ends Lat 38° 04' Long 46° 06'

Thursday March the 19th commences with a gale from the N^W 8th and the bark heading to the South under her storm sails at 4 P.M. took in the fore sail middle part fresh gales and squally daylight more moderate at double reefed topsails & courses at 8 A.M. kept her off N^W at meridian saw a sail steering to the S^W

Latitude 37° 44'
Longitude 46° 11'

Friday March the 20th 1846

commences with brisk gales from the S^W 8th and the bark steering to the N^W 8th under all prudent sail at sunset shortened sail for the night and luffed to the wind heading to the West at daylight a gale from the S^W at 20 ends Lat low

Saturday March the 21st

commences with a gale from the S^W and the bark heading N^W 8th under her storm sails at 5 P.M. took a squall and carried away the old foretopmast stay sail and wore ship to the S^W so ends saw a sail of the weather beam Lat 36° 12' low

Sunday March the 22nd

commences with a fresh gale from the S^W 8th and the bark steering N^W 8th under all sail at meridian spoke the brig Inga Cudworth 700^{tons} S^W - at sunset double reefed the topsails and set whole watches for home the bark steering N^W 8th middle part fresh gales at daylight made all sail the bark steering the same at 10 A.M. saw a Albesoar called him a sperm whale so ends Lat 35° 51' low 46° 06'
