

Monday March the 25th 1846
commences with fine pleasant weather and the bark
steering to the North middle part pleasant gales
daylight commenced breaking out the new studding
Sails saw nothing of note so ends lat low

Tuesday March the 24th commences with fine
pleasant weather the bark steering to the North at 2
got main royal, studding sails below and aloft middle
and latter part much the same so ends lat low

Wednesday March the 25th commences with
fine pleasant weather the bark steering to the
North under all sail middle part much the same
at daylight saw a sail to the NE at 10 A.M. spoke
her it proved to be the brig Frog of Bristol Primm
17 months out 170^{lbs} sperm let her have some
Bread so ends lat 35° lon 44° 12'

Thursday March the 26th commences
with fine pleasant weather the bark heading
to the NE at 2 P.M. part from her middle part much
the same saw nothing of note carried on spring the
main royal yard and set it down to repair
so ends lat low

Friday March the 27th 1846 commences with a
fresh breeze and the bark steering to the NE at 12 mid
the wind hauled to the NE and the bark heading E by N
middle part took in the studding sails latter part much
the same so ends lat low

Saturday March the 28th commences with
fresh breeze from the NE the bark heading to the
East at 10 A.M. bent a new maintop gallant sail and
a new main royal so ends lat 25° 50' lon 40° 50'

Sunday March the 29th commences with
fine pleasant weather at 3 P.M. bent and set
a foretop gallant sail at 12 midth double reefed
the foretop sail and took in the top gallant sails
At 10 A.M. double reefed the maintop sail saw
nothing of note so ends heading E by N lat 39° 30' lon

Monday March the 30th commences
with fresh breeze from the NE the bark heading E by N
at 2 P.M. shook 1 reef out of the maintop sail
at daylight saw a fish called it a sperm whale
were ship to the South it proved to be a
gray whale saw nothing else set main
top gallant sail so end lat low
