Remarks On Board Saturday April 25th 1846
first part of these 24 hours brisk breeze and clear
the bark steering N. W. by E. under all sail
middle and latter part the same saw nothing of note so ends
Latitude 9° 45' Longitude 50° 35'

Remarks on Board Sunday April the 26th
first part of these 24 hours fresh gales and clear the
Bark steering N. W. by E. Employed in fixing the
Rigging &c. &c. middle and latter part pleasant
gales from the N.E. and the bark steering N. W. by E.
under all sail saw nothing of note so ends
Latitude 11° 55' Longitude 50° 25'

Remarks On Board Monday April 27th
these 24 hours commence with pleasant gales from
the N.E. the bark steering N. W. by E. under all sail
middle part the same latter part pleasant gales
the bark steering the same At 11 A.M. saw some thing
of the weather bow ran close to it lowered
a boat and went to it in hopes to find out what
it was looked at it and came on board. Dared
not to touch it so ends
Latitude 13° 52' Longitude 54° 06'

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Remarks On Board Tuesday April 28th
commences with fine pleasant gales from
the N.E. and the bark steering N. W. by E. under
all sail at 1 P.M. saw a white water saw it once
and no more middle part light breeze latter part
light airs saw a sail to the South East steering
to the N. E. by E. saw a small quantity of gulf weed
so ends Latitude 15° 42' Longitude 55° 58'

Thursday
Remarks on Board Wednesday April 29th
these 24 hours commence with fine pleasant
weather the bark steering N. W. by E. saw a sail
at sunset saw a school of fish appearing much
like sperm whales lowered all the boats in
pursuit saw them one rising out of the
boats and no more so ends Lat 17° 41' Lon 56° 57'
