August the 10. Day These 24 hours Commences with a moderate Gale of wind from the S. S. W. and the topsails Clewed down on the Cap & hauled the maine sail and pinked the Gih at 1. Pm hoisted the maine top & l. at 2. Pm Set gih at 5 Pm Close reefed the fore & maine topsail & pinked Gih blowing & raining strong wind S. W. at 7 Pm Let the Gih & l. at 8. at 10 Pm pinked the Gih & hauled the maine sail up & blowing strong of wind from the S. W. & middle parts the same and at 3 Am Set the Gih and maine sail & more moderate at 5 Am turned reefs out of the topsails fore & l. and Set the maine topgallant sail & at 7 a strong breeze and rain & squally at half past 7 the watch carried and employed in Ship's Duty & l. and latter parts strong breeze and fresh breeze at leaving Set and Latt in by Chh 39. 47. North and Long in 36. 11. West Long Tim 8. l.

August the 11 Day These 24 hours Commences with strong breeze from the S. S. W. and Course S. E. by E. and the watch employed in Ship's Duty. Saw a making nets in the straits & l. at 4. Pm rack off work at 8 Pm strong breeze

from the S. W. and pleasant weather & middle parts the same & all sail set & at half past 7 Am the watch carried and employed in Ship's Duty & strong breeze from the S. W. at 9 Am Made the island of Flores and sound these 24 hours at 12 Close in with Flores under the land & latt in 39. 26. North & Long in 31. 07. West Long 8. l. & l.

August the 12 Day These 24 hours Commences with strong breeze from the S. W. & close haul with the land and saw two ships the barado and the Enterprise and our Capt. Young & a boat and women long side of them & poured out the row and came on board & made sail for the Island of pyall & l. at 8 Pm the winds more moderate and middle parts light winds from the S. W. and Course S. E. & at 2 Am a heavy shower of rain at half past 7 the watch carried and employed in Ship's Duty & light winds & thick weather & no land insight & at 10 Am saw spouts what they were we did not see & at twelve we got ready for lowering & sound these 6 hours & Latt in by Tide reckoning we are in 38. 48 North and Long in 30. 21. West Long Tim 8. 10. Sound

August the 13 Day These 24 hours Commences with Calms and lowered a way of ten Pinnaces black pitch but did not get many words & came on board & at 2 Pm saw sail & l. at 3. Calms & l. Course S. E. at 4. Pm a light breeze wind from the N. E. & middle part running round the island at 6 Am Calms at 8 Am bent the barbed cable at 6 Am a head of wind of the land at half past 7 the watch carried and employed in Ship's Duty & close in under the land & we took and half took up towards full & at 11 Am the Capt went ashore & a long insight standing round the other side of the island & wind fresh breeze from the S. E. & cloudy & sound these 6 hours off one of the western Island Carled Small a portugese island and S. E. point 38. 30. North Latt in 28. 12. West

August the 24 Day These 24 hours Commences with fresh breeze from the S. E. and we are a laying of & on the island of pyall and the Capt a shore with a water crew & l. and at 2 Pm the Capt came on board & ran in the harbour and the water boat came a long
