with 24 Whales and and we took in all Sails & light winds & C.
pleasant weather & C. at 8 Pm caulked and made all Sails
and 8 Sails insight & C. at 11 Pm Spoke the Ship Herald
of New Bedford with 4 Whales Capt. Huntington and Sounds
these 24 hours and Sails in by Clock 39:16 South
and Long in 41:05 West & C.

Thursday October 15th These 24 hours Commences With
all Sails set and fresh breeze from the N. N. W. & C.
at 4 Pm 6 Sails insight at 7 Pm took in all Sails and

and Strong wind from the N. N. W. & C. and middle
part strong breeze from the North at 5 Pm all hands
caulked to make Sails & set double reefed topsails and 4

Friday October 16th These 24 hours Commences with
Strong breeze from the North & C. at 6 Pm Saw whales
and lowered but did not get fast & came on board and

and a plenty of whales insight & C. and middle part fresh breeze
from the North & at 5 Pm all hands caulked and scrape
off Decks and a gale of wind and Rain and in company
with the Commodore Rogers & C. and latter part of these 24 hours
a gale of wind from the North and rainy & C. & no Clock this
Day but by Judgement we are in 39:03 South Sails
and Long in 43:03 West & C.

Saturday October 17th These 24 hours Commences with
a gale of wind and Rain and thick weather & wind N. by E.
and with our Sails and boats on board and caught watchmen
