forebail and flying sheets and all hands employed in the Sabbath
&c. at 9 Pm set Double reefed sails & a strange sail insight to
the windward and fresh breeze from the S. W. and sounds these 24
hours and Sall in by Chk 39: 25 South and Long in 43: 47 West.

Monday October 19th these 24 hours commences with a strange
breeze from the S. W. and flying clouds and with our Starboard
tacks on board and thick weather &c. at 7 Pm fished the gill
and mainsail and set conputer watches under Double reefed sails
and strong breeze from the S. W. by S. & flying clouds &c.
and middle parts with breeze from the N. E. W. at 2 Pm wore
ship at 8 Pm cawled all hands & made all sail and a sail
insight to the leeward and fresh breeze from the N. E. W. &c.
and at half past 10 Pm spoke the Ship Americans of Sag Harbor
Sall in by Chk 39: 02 South and Long in 43: 25 West &c.

Tuesday October 20th These 24 hours commences with fresh
breeze from the N. E. W. at 1 Pm saw a ship to the wind

at 7 Pm took in all sail and set 4 watches &c. and middle

Wednesday October 21st these 24 hours commences with strong
breeze from the West and thick cloudy weather and all sail
set and course E. by S. and a plenty of supposed round and
a plenty of Spanish &c. at half past 6 Pm took in all sail & by to and thick
cloudy weather and winds South and blowing strong and had looking weather
&c. and middle parts fresh breeze from the S. E. W. at 5 Pm all hands
cawled to make all sail and winds S. E. and thick cloudy weather at 6
Pm saw a strange sail and W. with our Starboard tacks on board
&c. and half past 11 Pm saw 2 right whales and sounds these 24 hours
and Sall in by Date reckoning 39: 50 South and Long in 43: 50 West

Thursday October 22nd These 24 hours commences with thick
cloudy weather and at half past 12 lowered away all 4 boates and
the Starboard boate got fast and sunk the Whale and the Starboard
boate got fast and sound and the White boate got fast and saved
the whale and got him a long side at 3 Pm and began to cut
him in and finished at 7 Pm and took in all sail and let
one sail in sight and winds East and cloudy weather &c.
and at half past 8 Pm set 4 watches &c. and middle parts
light winds from the North at 5 Pm all hands cawled and
set double reef topsails and blowing strong from the S. E. W.
and a plenty of whales at half past 10 Pm hove a way but
did not get fast and sounds these 24 hours and Sall in by
Chk 40: 10 South and Long in 40: 07 West &c.

Friday Oct 23rd these 24 hours commences with fresh
breeze from the North and all hands employed in cutting up
theber at 2 Pm took in sail &c. at 6 Pm set conputer
watches and strong breeze from the North and cloudy weather
