

Wednesday November 26th the Year 1821. P.M.
 Remarks On board of the Ship William of Fairhaven
 the first part of these 24 hours commenced with fresh breezes
 from the S. W. and in company with the Ship Leonidas and
 all hands employed in hoisting Oil and all Sail Set &c.
 at 4 P.M. the weather moderated and we with our harboured
 took on board &c. at 5 P.M. saw strange Sail in to the
 West of us and at half past 7 P.M. took in Sail & set the
 watch and hoisting Oil at 11 P.M. finished & Calm. Dried the
 wrocks &c. at 1 P.M. all hands caulked & made all Sail &c. in
 Company with the Ship Leonidas and all of us employed in Stowing
 Down Oil and light winds from the E. N. E. East &c. latter parts
 calm & Smooth the 24 hours &c. Lat in by Clock 41. 47 South
 Wind Long in 41. 34 West Long in &c.

Thursday November 26th These 24 hours commenced with all hands
 employed in Stowing Down Oil & a light breeze of wind from the
 East & in Company with the Ship Leonidas of Fairhaven &c.
 at 5 P.M. finished Stowing Oil &c. at 7 P.M. took in all Sail
 and winds North &c. at half past 4 P.M. all hands caulked
 to make Sail & fresh breezes from the South and 3 Sail
 in Sight at 7 P.M. spoke the Ship Enterprise of
 Newberford Capt. Tilton with one Whale &c. at 10
 P.M. saw whales & heard away but did not get past
 and latter parts of these 24 hours strong breezes from the
 N. N. W. and Lat in by Clock 41. 55 South & Long in 42. 11

Friday November 27th These 24 hours commenced with
 strong breezes from the N. N. W. and all hands employ-
 ed in Ship's Duty &c. at 5 P.M. spoke Ship Election
 of Newberford Capt. Griffin. With 8 Whales &c.
 at 7 P.M. took in all Sail and blowing strong from the S.W. and
 middle part a Gale of wind &c. at half 6 P.M. all hands
 caulked and finished the foremast & blowing a gale of wind from
 the S.W. &c. and latter parts of these 24 gale of wind and
 rain &c. Oh this Day had by Tide rock rising we are
 in 41. 57 South Lat by Long in 42. 22 West Long in &c.

Saturday November 28th the Remarks On board of
 the Ship William of Fairhaven of Sheffield. Reed & Harlow
 &c. the first part of these 24 hours commenced with a gale
 of wind and rain & winds from the N. N. W. &c. &c.
 at 3 P.M. all hands caulked & wore Ship & minding & blowing strong
 and all hands employed in Hoisting Ship &c. at 6 P.M. set the
 watch & a light breeze of wind from the N. N. W. &c. and
 a large Swell on &c. and middle parts Calm &c. at 8 P.M.
 all hands caulked to make Sail & Calm &c. 3 Sail in sight &c.
 at 11 P.M. saw eight whales & heard away but did not get past
 and hands these 24 hours and Lat in by Clock 41. 11 South
 Wind Long in 41. 52 West Long in &c.

Sunday November 29th the first part of these 24 hours commen-
 ced in Hoisting the boats off at 1 mile in head &c. at 2 P.M. heard
 a way & boats but did not get past & all hands employed in Hoisting
 minding the foremast &c. at half past 7 P.M. took in topgal-
 lantsails & fly Gilt. and Calm and pleasant weather & 4 Sail in
 sight &c. and middle part Calm &c. at 6 P.M. all hands caulked
 and set topgalantsails & fly Gilt & light winds from the S. W.
 &c. 4 Sail in Sight and all hands employed in the Sabbath day
 &c. at 10 P.M. on board the foremast and hands these 24 hours
 with Calm & pleasant weather & Lat in by Clock 41. 00 South
 Wind Long in 41. 44 West &c. &c.

Monday November 30th the first part of these 24 hours
 commenced with all hands employed in repairing the foremast
 and light winds from the S. W. & pleasant weather and 4 Sail in
 sight &c. at 5 P.M. bent the foremast & cleared off Poles &
 Calm & 5 Sail in sight &c. at 7 P.M. spoke the Ship George Porter
 of Newberford Capt. Weeks with 6 Whales and the same
 time spoke the Ship Atlas of Newberford Capt. Gardner with
 7 Whales &c. and middle parts Calm &c. at 1 P.M. all hands caulked
 to make Sail and in Company with the George Porter and Ship Atlas
 &c. at 7 P.M. on board the main topgalantsail & repaired it and light breezes
 from the north &c. and these 24 hours Lat in by Clock
 41. 17 South Wind Long in 41. 02 West Long in &c.
