

and middleport shrouds & lightning mast etc. at 4 P.m. all hands lowered & thick foggy weather & calm & all hands employed in washing ship at 8 P.m. with sail & all hands employed in sweeping house etc. at half past 11 P.m. saw eight whales etc. and all 4 boats longer for them & the boat got fast and saved the whale & the Starboard boat saved another one at half past 3 P.m. got them a long side and commenced cutting them in etc. at 8 P.m. finished cutting one of them in and took in all sail and light wind from from the west and set up 4 watches etc. and middleport Calm etc. at 4 P.m. all hands commenced cutting the whale that has been a leaping a long side all night etc. at half past 7 P.m. finished the whale & Calm & rain and cleared off decks a watch below & the watch on deck got the log works underway etc. at 11 P.m. cleared off & pleasant weather and sounds these 24 hours and Latitude by Chron 14° 15' South and Longitude in 39° 14' West etc. etc.

Monday January 11th These 24 hours commenced With all hands employed in hoisting sail and blowing fresh from the W. S. W. & flying clouds etc. at 2 P.m. saw whales and long way & boats but did not get fast & came on board and blowing strong and took in all sail etc. at 6 P.m. set the watch and employed in hoisting Oil & blowing a gale from the S. S. W. etc. and middleport more moderate but a large sea on etc. at 7 P.m. the watch commenced and more moderate weather but blowing strong from the S. S. W. and the watch employed in hoisting Oil and a large sea on etc. at 10 P.m. saw a. Shrove sail at half past 11 P.m. spoke the ship Planter of Nantucket Capt Fisher With 800 bbls of Oil and sounds these 24 hours and Latitude by Chron 14° 14' South and Longitude in 39° 31' West

Tuesday January 12th These 24 hours commenced With a strong breeze of wind from the S. S. W. and the watch employed in hoisting Oil etc. at 4 P.m. the watch commenced & all hands employed in lowering up and clearing off Decks and set the gill & Mizzen top sail & a fresh breeze from the west and in company with the Planter etc. at half past 6 P.m. set the watch and employed in hoisting Oil etc. at 7 P.m. saw whales & took in the gill & Mizzen top sail etc. and middleport light wind from the west and pleasant weather at half past 8 P.m. the

watch commenced and a plenty of Whales at 6 P.m. heard many boats and the Starboard Boat got fast & men his line & hoisted and came on board and got breakfast & landed a way & boats a gain and the Starboard boat got fast and saved the Whale and got him a long side etc. at 10 P.m. and Cold Down the log works and commenced cutting in the Whale and the Ship planter cutting another Whale at the same time and sounds these 24 hours with a strong breeze from the west & Latitude by Chron 14° 15' South etc. and Longitude in 39° 14' West etc. etc.

Wednesday January 13th These 24 hours commenced With all hands employed in cutting the Whale and at 3 P.m. finished and got the log works underway and broke out the porthole and went to Stowing Down at 4 P.m. knock off at half past 9 P.m. set the watch and light wind from the west & rain etc. and middleport gale of wind from the E. S. E. and rain & etc. at half past 6 P.m. the watch commenced and Stowing Down from the East and Sun rain and all hands employed in hoisting Oil & Stowing Down Oil in the porthole and latter part of these 24 hours moderate thick weather and in Chron this Day but by side reckoning we are in 14° 15' South and Longitude in 39° 13' West Longitude

Thursday January 14th These 24 hours commenced With light winds from the South and thick weather and all hands employed in Stowing Down Oil in the porthole and Sun hands in hoisting Oil as far as part is in side with the Oil etc. at 6 P.m. finished Stowing Down and Stowing strong from the S. S. W. etc. at 7 P.m. set the watch and employed in hoisting Oil etc. and middleport a gale of wind and rain transfer & lightning etc. at 8 P.m. the watch commenced and blowing a gale of wind from the W. S. W. etc. and a heavy squall of wind & rain cloud up the main top sail and cold down the works & all hands below for a new & then more moderate and set the watch and employed in hoisting Oil etc. and latter part of these 24 hours ends with a gale of wind from the S. S. W. and Latitude by Chron 14° 15' South etc. and Longitude in 39° 14' West etc. etc.
