Remarks On board the Ship Alliance of Fairhaven
know at this time On the Banks of a Wha-
ling voyage So the first part of this Day commenced
With a Gale of wind from the N. E. W. and the
watch employed in boiling Oil &c. at 4 Pm the
watch ceased and blowing a Gale of wind at 6 Pm
Set the watch & employed in boiling Oil &c. and middle
part the fresh Gale of wind from the West at 5 Pm watch
ceased & blowing a Gale from the west and all hands em-
ployed in boiling Oil &c. Stowing Down in the Afterhold and
Stowed these 24 hours and finished boiling Oil for this time and
Set Sail by Clock 41° 31' South and Long in 37° 15' West

Saturday January 16th The first part of these 24 hours com-
menced With a strong breeze of wind from the S. W. and all
hands employed in Stowing Down Oil at 4 Pm the watch more
ceased & Set the gill & Mizzen sail at 9 Pm hove
off Stowing Down Oil and Set the watch and Calms on a
large swell on & and middle part a light air of wind from
the S. E. at 4 Pm all hands ceased and Set the fore
topsail and a plenty of whale insight at 6 Pm broad away
3 boats and the west boat got past and South the whale and got her
a long Side at 10 Pm and commenced cutting him in and Stowed
these 24 hours and Set in by Clock 40° 47' South
and Long in 37° 30' West &c.

Sunday January 17th these 24 hours commenced all hands em-
ployed in cutting the whale and a fresh breeze from the West
at 3 Pm finished cutting in at 4 Pm Saw more Whales
and broad away 4 boats and saved one to the Starboard
boat and got him a long Side at 6 Pm and commenced cutting
him in and a Ship insight to the windward and a fresh breeze
from the N. E. W. at half past 4 Pm finished cutting in the
whale and took in all Sail and Set the watch and got the
mizzen under way at and middle part fresh breeze from the west
at 4 Pm ceased the watch and good weather winds West
and insight cutting a Whale at 5 Pm saw more
whale and broad away 4 boats but did not get past came on

Board and all hands employed in boiling Oil and Stowing provisions
down the forehold &c. at 11 Pm Saw more Whales and broad away
3 boats but did not get past and came on board and Stowed
these 24 hours and no Chk this Day but by dead reckoning we
are in Lat 40° 15' South and Long in 37° 40' West &c.

Monday January 18th the first part of these 24 hours
commenced With pleasant weather winds N. W. and all
hands employed in boiling Oil and Stowing &c. Stowing oil
Down in the fore hold &c. at 4 Pm Saw more whales and
broad away 3 boats & the Starboard boat got past and
lost his line & Whale & coming on board spoke the Ship
Teresa of Nantucket Capt. With 40 blks of Oil
and came Onboard and took in all Sail and at 7 Pm
Set the watch and employed boiling Oil &c. and middle
part light winds & thick weather & Saw rain &c. at 8 Pm
ceased the watch & a very thick fog light winds from the north
and all hands employed in boiling &c. Stowing Oil in the after
hold &c. and later part of these 24 hours with very thick fog &
a fresh breeze of wind from the North & wait and no Chk
this day but by Dead reckoning we are in Lat 41° 15' South
and Long in 37° 35' West &c.

Tuesday January 19th These 24 hours commenced with a fresh
breeze of wind from the N. E. W. and thick weather and
all hands employed in boiling Oil &c. Stowing Down in the after hold
at 3 Pm Choke off the after hold &c. at 4 Pm Set the
watch & employed in boiling Oil &c. thick weather &c. and
middle part thick rainy weather & cooled down the stow works
at 5 Pm got them under way a gain &c. at 6 Pm ceased
the watch and a fresh breeze of wind from the S. W. and
2 Set insight and all hands employed in boiling Oil &c. at 11 Pm
Saw Whales and broad away 3 boats & got a Whale to the Starboard
boat and Stowed these 24 hours with light winds and pleasant weather
and Set in by Clock 40° 37' South and Long in 37° 53' West

Wednesday January 20th these 24 hours commenced With the
boats off killing a Whale at 2 Pm got the whale a long Side
at 3 Pm commenced cutting him in at 7 Pm finished and
