Sunday February 7th these 24 hours Commenced with
Strong breeze from the West & course N. by E. and
employed in cleaning ship and all sail set. at 4.
Pm. Landed the Watch & all hands employed in washing
off Decks & at 8 Pm. Set the Watch & blowing strong
from the N.W. & at midday blowing strong &
at 1 Pm. blowing stronger & stronger & fished the mainsail
& then doubled the mainsail & then the fore topsail and
the mizen topsail & fished the Gird. & cleaning whale bone
at the same time & being on the Sabbath Day it is not
a custom on the Sabbath Day to work but if we can't do
as we would we must do as we would at half past 7 Am.
the watch landed & blowing a gale of wind from the N.W. &
and at 8 Pm. the watch on Deck employed in cleaning bone
at 9 Pm. a severe Squall and rain and hauled the fore-
sail for 24 hours or more so & then hauled the fore-
sail and then the watch employed in cleaning again & at 10 Pm.
Sailed these 24 hours & by Chb this Day but by Day reckoning
we are in Lat 35.17. South. And Long in 35.15. West &.

Monday February 8th these 24 hours Commenced with
Strong gale of wind from the N.W. & Squally & some
rain & course N. by E. & under Close reef mainsail at 2.
Pm. Set the fore topsail at 1 Pm. Set the mizen topsail but
blowing strong from the N.W. & a large swell on &
at 10 Pm. thunder lightning rain & Squally & at half past
7 Pm. the watch landed and all hands employed in getting
up Stairs sails hoists on the yards & at 8 Pm. Strong breeze from
the West & at 9 Pm. Commenced heaving fair sails for
the passage home to America to Fairhaven Massachusetts
& at 10 Pm. the topsail of these 24 hours. Ends with Squall
of wind and rain and Sall in by Chb 35.00
at the End. Long in 33.00. West &.

Tuesday February 9th the year of our Lord 1850

Lard on board & at 8 Pm. In these 24 hours Commenced
with all hands employed in Ships Duty & Squally weather
wind from the N.W. & at 5 Pm. weather more moderate
and at 6 Pm. Stairs sails at half past 6 Pm. knock off work &
at 8 Pm. thick Clouds and some rain & at 10 Pm. Stairs sails
breeze from the N.W. & flying Clouds & at half past
7 Pm. the watch landed & all hands employed in Royal-
march & Royal guards & other Ships Duty and light winds
from the South & pleasant Weather & at 10 Pm. topsail of this
24 hours. A light breeze from the S.W. and Sall in by
Chb 34.58 South End. Long in 32.47. West &.

Wednesday February 10th these 24 hours Commenced
with all hands employed in Ships Duty & and at 10 Pm. a
light sea of wind from the South and pleasant weather
at half past 6 Pm. knock off work & at 8 Pm. and
at 10 Pm. Landed & light at 2 Pm. from the North &
at half past 7 Pm. Landed the Watch landed & Calms pleasant
and all hands employed in cleaning. Whalbone & at 10 Pm.
took a breeze of wind from the N.E. and Sailed these 24
hours and Sall in by Chb 34.40. South End. Long
in 32.30. West &.

Thursday February 11th these 24 hours Commenced
with all hands employed in cleaning bone & light winds from
the N.E. & at 4 Pm. fore topsail & at 6 Pm.
knock off work and fished rigals & fly. Set 3. mizen topsail
at 10 Pm. and middlemast. Strong breeze from the N.W. &
at 10 Pm. flying Clouds & at half past 7 Pm. the watch landed
and all hands employed in cleaning bone & Strong breeze from
the North & at 10 Pm. Doubled reefed topsail and Sailed these
24 hours and Sall in by Chb 34.20. South
End. Long in 32.00. West &.
