Friday Feb 13

This day begins with strong winds from the N. W. by N. Watch employed in ship duty took in studding sails and double reefed the top sail hoisted up the boats one sail in sight latter part middle part the wind blew stronger double reefed the top sail latter part shook out the reef and set the fore and main top gallant sail so ends. Latt. Song

Saturday 14. This day begins with the wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. Watch employed in making scrub berms. Middle part set the studding sail latter part strong wind took in the studding sail so ends. Latt. Song

Sunday Feb 15. This day commences with light wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. took in the fore and main top gallant sail sent overboard the clew garnet and fore top gallant bunt. Latter part saw 1 Shark and one ship made all sail so ends. Latt. Song

Monday 16

This day commences with strong wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. one ship in sight latter part 1 sail in sight so ends. Latt. Song

Tuesday 17

This day commences with light wind and variable steering S. E. by E. Watch employed in ship duty. Boat out for water spoke the Royal Breeze of London bound to port Philip latter part calm at sails in sight so ends. Latt. Song

Wednesday 18

This day begins with calm watch employed in ship duty lowered the larboard boat and struck one Shark and one fish and got it. Latter part light winds and variable weather employed in ship duty one sail in sight so ends. Latt. Song

Thursday Feb 19

This day commences with light wind and variable watch employed in breaking out for hogs kept one Barque in sight latter part strong wind raised up a whale covered the larboard boat but Black fish gobbled them and did not get any more large in sight so ends. Latt. Song

Friday 20

This day commences with strong wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. double reefed the top sails latter part strong winds from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. made all sail but the wind increased and double reefed the top sails saw Black fish so ends this day. Latt. Song

Saturday 21

This day commences with strong wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. under double reefed top sails latter part strong wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. made all sail so ends. Latt. Song

Sunday 22

This day commences with a gale of wind from the N. W. heading to the S. under close reefed the top sail latter part steering under single reefed top sail so ends. Latt. Song

Monday 23

This day begins with a gale of wind from the N. W. steering S. under close reefed main top sail latter part made all sail. Watch employed in ship duty so ends this day. Latt. Song

Tuesday 24

This day begins with strong winds from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. Watch employed in ship duty. Latter part a fine wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. Watch employed in ship duty so ends. Latt. Song

Wednesday 25 This day begins with moderate winds and fine weather. Wind from the N. W. steering S. E. by E. Watch employed in ship duty so ends. Latt. Song
