This day commences with light wind, raised
clouds fish, got the boats ready but did not
proceed further. at eleven down double reefed the
top sails. Latter part, made all sail.
to cross this day. Late Long

Thursday 20.
This day commenced with light wind
weather employed in mending the forest.
Have no seeds left ^{left} only

Wednesday 21
This day begins with strong wind from
the N by E, steering by the wind watch
employed in mending the fore top sail
Toward part the wind shifted S. steering N.
So ends this day I all Day

Thursday 22
This day commences with strong wind from
the S. Sailing N. E. I watch employed
in ship duty and minding the main
sail. So ends. I att Larig

Friday 2^d
This day began with strong wind from the
N by E. at 3 PM saw land bearing S by E 1/2
S.  took in top galant
Three Kings..

Sail and dingy raised top sail at 11 AM. The eye
to the fore yard parted. Broke out for water
Can catch fish. By 1 PM. Boat Long

Saturday 24.
The day commences with light wind from the N.E. stirring by the island. Land is in sight. water improved as I keep steady. Latter part saw a school of black fish about the Sauterwater and they got low down at the minute 11.30 boat but did not get fast. at 4.00
Sat. 25. 1894.

PK remarks. On Board ship Cin. a 1st. April
Sunday 25

This day begins with calm and ends with light winds blowing. O. N. M. watch engaged in cooking etc. so ends the day. Little to report.

Monday 25
This day we commenced with light wind from the S. steering O.K. to watch employed in cutting up black fish heads. 16 ends, 14 ft long

Tuesday 22
Rain day commences with light breeze from
the S.W. Steering N.E. by E. Latib employed
in cutting out stanchion & battens, work in making
a new main chain. 250 cwt. Lead. Long

Thursday 28.
This day commences with calm and in the
night winds rising to 6. water improves
in their date. So on. Light Long

Thursday 28
This day commenced with light wind from
the N. W. during A. M. water employed
in breaking out for water and provision
latter part, strong wind from S. E. during
A. M. spoke and yam in the
River of Manchester. 20 month or 500
bl of oil. She was sailing sailing in a large
whale. The Captain went on board and heard the
news and then came back and cried good and
and stood on his knees, praising God. Long

This day began with strong wind from the
 N. W. & strong N. E. and dinged reefed topsails
 with a single reef in fore top sail, raised masts
 toward the boats, but without success
