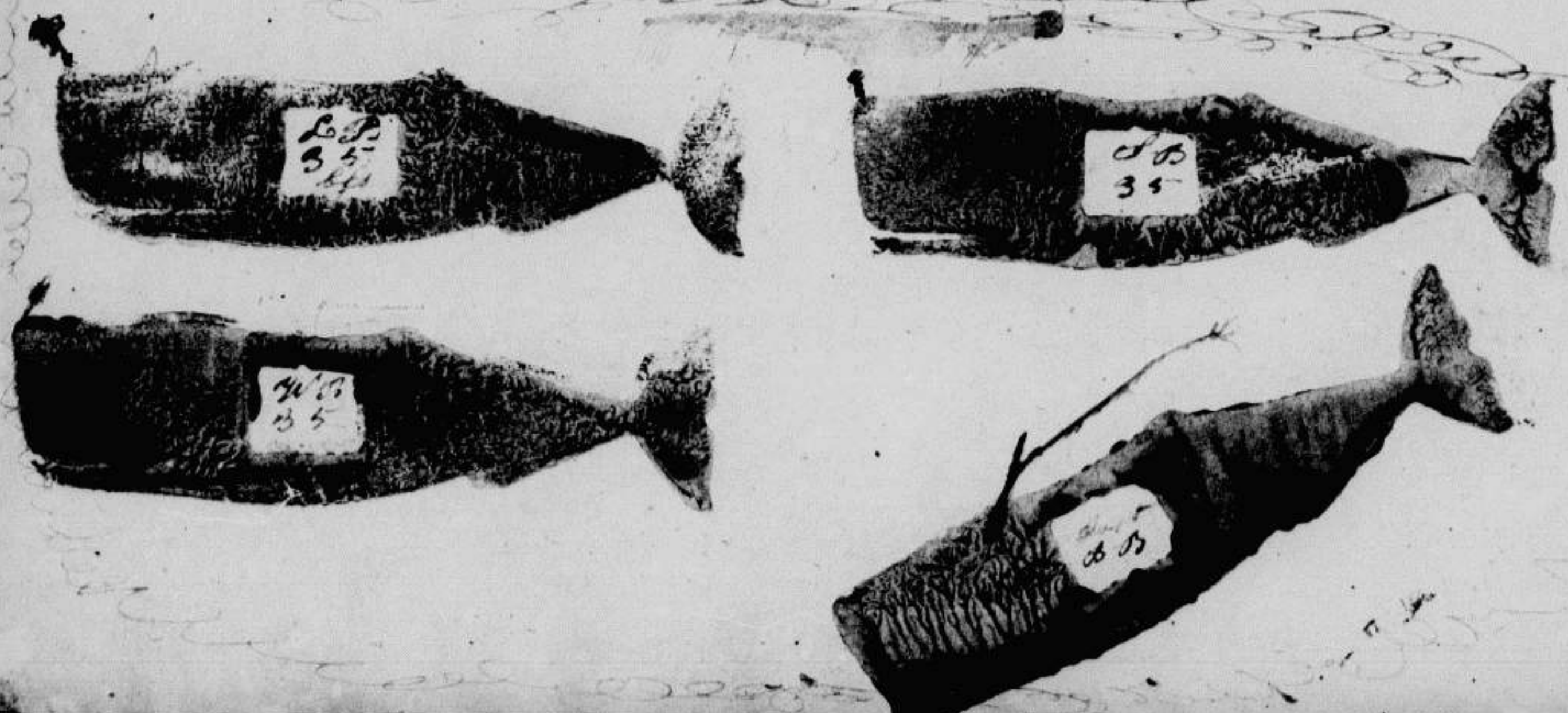

January 1, 1853

This day commences with fine weather and a plenty of whales. Towed the boat for them. The Bow boat went on and struck, and the Line parted. The Waist boat struck a small whale and then cut from him and struck a 16.5 lb. whale. The Starboard went on and struck a 16.5 lb. whale. The Bow boat went on and struck the captain's whale. Took and took him aboard. Took 3 whales along side and cut 2 of them in. The middle boat stood by watches and cut up 2 heads and put them in the tank. Latter part called all hands and cut the other whale in and went to trying out. So ends new years day. Lat Long

Sunday January 2
begins with looking out whales and ends with weather same with and weather fine and favorable so ends. Lat Long

Monday 3
This day broke out and stored down oil and trying out blubber oil. Nothing in sight sight and light from the N Ship heading in to the S and E. So ends

Tuesday 4
first part of this day all hands employed in trying out and storing down oil. finished storing down. middle part cooled down the works and cleaned the tank out. Latter washed off decks and mended the most heads. so ends. Lat Long

Wednesday 5
commences with light winds from the N. Shoring by the wind. first part watch employed in cooping the oil and prepared to store down at sundown took in the middle part light wind and cold
