Remarks on Board Sunday August 1st 1830

First part of these 24 hours Begins with a light breeze and pleasant weather we saw some Grampassis and Porpoises?

Middle part Light Breeze and calm at 6 P.M. a light breeze sprang up from the Southward driving S.E.

Latter part Brisk Breeze and pleasant weather at 12 past 11 we saw the appearance of Land but not Shore?

Lat 39° 22' N Long by Chronometer 32° 11' W

Remarks on Board Monday August 2nd 1830

First part these 24 hours Begins with a smart Breeze and pleasant weather at 1 P.M. we saw the Land of Flowers Bay S.E. Dist 21 Leagues we saw the Ship Henry of Sag Harbor had her Boat on Shore at 5 P.M. we went on Shore to see if we could get potatoes and Onions and hogs &c at dark the Boat came off with some potatoes and Onions.

Middle part Strong Breeze and thick at Day Light we went on Shore with the Boat to make a quick despatch?

Latter part Ends with a strong Breeze and pleasant weather too more Ships Steering in for the Land?

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 3rd 1830

This 24 hours Begins with a strong breeze from the Southward we were employing in bringing the Ship the Names of these Ships is the North America of Hanson and the Kearsley of New London She has got one Spum whale and the Ship Navigator in Sight to Santa Rosa

Middle part Strong Breeze from westward Steaming off and on at Day light we sent the Boat on Shore again and this is our chief Employment the Remainder of this Day

Latter part there is a rather Ship in Sight Nothing Remarkable this 24 hours?

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 4th 1830

These 24 hours Continues with a strong breeze from the westward Employing in felling of Potatoes or Onions and hogs &c and on small Bullocks?

Middle part Strong breeze and squally thick fog and a plenty of Rain?

Latter part Light Breeze and Rainy weather Employing in felling of Potatoes &c at 9 A.M. we went from this part to get another for some more things for we had not got what we wanted hear the Ship John Adams of Nantucket his Course bear

Remarks on Board Thursday August 5th 1830

These 24 hours Begins with a moderate breeze and hazy weather we went on Shore to Sanderosee for more Onions at 6 P.M. we speak the brig partment of Sanderosee with no sail there is 5 Sails of vessels Recreiting at the island?

Middle part Light Breezes and thick weather

Latter Part is finished and Recreiting and Squared the yards the wind to the Northward we started in company with the North American and Master S. G. with a smart Breeze?

Remarks on Board Friday August 6th 1830

This 24 hours continues with a strong breeze from the Northward and hazy weather at 1 P.M. the South head of Flowers Bay is by N. Distane 6 Leagues from which I take my Departure from the Bay in the Lat 39° 26' N Long 31° 07' W at 5 P.M. we saw 2 spots of whale on hillers and which we do not know they were going quick to the westward?

Middle part Strong breezes and squally and thick weather

Latter part least the same remarks in top Gallant Sails and keep the topsails all hands Employing in trimming Ship &c
