This 24 hours continues with a strong breeze from the N. E. driving South the Ship Mercator is in sight we have lost sight of the North American Sa. Stern

Middle part moderate breeze and fair weather

Latter part about the same the watch employing in Ships Duty the Mercator is in sight Nothing remarkable the 24 hours only too much of Duty Sick.

Remarks on Board Sunday August 8th 1830

This 24 begins with a moderate breeze from the S. E. driving West by the wind to the S. W. the watch employing in putting up the ^{boards} and up in the Vals at 6 p. M. spoke the Mercator and went on Board to get some Books for a table and we let her have a signal in return

Middle part some squalls and little rain,

Latter part light breezes and pleasant weather the Mercator is in sight Nothing in sight nothing remarkable of use

Latt by Obs 32. 24. N Long by Chronometer 30. 44. West

Remarks on Board Monday August 9th 1830

This 24 hours continues with a light ^{breeze} and pleasant weather the watch employing in filling and Lutting the Ship Mercator is in company

Middle part about the same only the Capt is not very well

Latter part ends with a fine breeze and pleasant weather the watch employing in putting up the ^{boards} and up in the Vals at 6 p. M. spoke the Mercator and went on Board to get some Books for a table and we let her have a signal in return

Latt by Obs 30 26 N Long by Chronometer 30 13 30 West

Remarks on Board Tuesday August 10th 1830

This 24 hours begins with a fine breeze from the Eastward driving S by E the Mercator in sight Stern

Middle part fine breeze and pleasant weather

Latter part the wind and weather about the same the Cooper and Carpenter is a sheathing the deck and the others more employing as usual at 10 A. M. we passed by a brig Sailing west with all sail set to Ende

Latt 27. 45. N Long 28. 48. 48. West

Remarks on Board Wednesday August 11th 1830

This 24 hours continues with a strong breeze and pleasant weather the Mercator out of sight at Stern

Middle part light breeze and pleasant Sailing sharp by the wind to the Southward

Latter part the employing in sheathing the Deck S. S. Nothing in sight

Latt by Obs 25. 17. N Long by Chronometer 28. 14. 50. West

Remarks on Board Thursday August 12th 1830

This 24 hours continues with a moderate breeze and thick weather driving sharp by the wind to the Southward Employing as usual

Middle part light breeze and heavy weather

Latter part strong breeze the watch employing in Lutting the Ship we have built up the Blacksmiths forge to do some work
