

Ship Emerald off New Bedford Bound on a Whaling Voyage to the

Remarks on Board Sunday Oct. 17th 1830

This 24 hours commences with a light breeze and pleasant weather
Employing in Steering Down at 2 p M. Saw a fin back the finished Steering
Down for this time at 3 p M. Saw a Right Whale Leard gut fast
but the Line parted and the Whale went off with two rows in front. Took
Some on board and took in Sails

Middle part Light air and Calm

Latter part fine Breeze and pleasant Weather at 7 a M. Saw 3 Right
Whales Leard but did not Strike for the Whales gut Leard and they
went off and we came on Board to look for more one Sails in Sight Sailed

Lat 37.09 South Long 50.32 West

Remarks on Board Monday October 18th 1830

This 24 hours commences with a light breeze and pleasant weather we saw
one Right Whale Leard but did not Strike for he was as going to the Westward
Like the rest. So we came on Board and took in Sails and headed to the Westward
the wind to the Northward

Middle part Light Breeze at 8 a M. Looked to the

Northward saw some fin backs but no Right Whales

Remarks on Board Tuesday October 19th 1830

This 24 hours commences with a strong breeze heading to the Eastward
two Sails in Sight and the Surrons Whale

Middle part Strong Breeze from the Northward at 8 a M. three Sails
in Sight at 9 a M. Saw one Right Whale Leard but did not Strike
for he was as going to the Westward Like the rest Very Wild Sails
this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Wednesday October 20th 1830

This 24 hours continues with a fresh breeze and a heavy weather the Wind to the
Northward we tooked Ship was required 3 Ships in Site but No Right Whale plenty of
Finbacks in Site at dark 10 Sails upon the topsails

Middle part Strong Breeze and heavy weather at day Light we had Sails at 5 a M.
Saw one Right Whale Leard and gut fast and killed him and took him a Long Side
the Ship and began to cut him in and finished at 10

this 24 hours ends with a fresh breeze and quiet weather

Remarks on Board Thursday October 21st 1830

This 24 hours continues with a strong breeze from the Eastward and begins
the Ship heading to the Westward at 2 p M. we commenced bying it is a Right
Whale at dark we shot two Sails Nothing in Site at present

Middle and latter

part Light Breeze and thick weather saw one Sails and a Right whale they were
very wild some Finbacks and humpbacks Leards looking the Whales

Remarks on Board Friday October 22nd 1830

This 24 hours commences with a moderate breeze and thick heavy weather
Employing in bying Saw one Right Whale but he was as going to the
Westward quite on Sails in Sight at 6 p M. we saw one Right Whale
he was a Right Whale Leard gut fast killed him and took him to the Ship
and put the flesh down on and took in Sails for the night

Middle part

almost calm at day light we commenced in cutting in the Whale at
9 a M. finished cutting in commenced bying

Latter part Strong Breeze and quiet
