

Remarks on Board Saturday October 23rd 1830

This 24 hours commences With a Strong Breeze the Wind to the N. E. & the Wind hauled to the N. W. Employing in boiling and began to break out the Mains hold to put some oil down at 11 am 3 Whales Lard too Boats got fast to different Whales killed one and took her by the side and by the side and the Whale went off took her along side and put the Chain on and commenced towing towing the oil & Lard Sticks down about 60 barrels of oil

Middle part Strong Breeze and Foggy Weather at day & Light. We commenced cutting in the Whale at 9 am finished cutting and cleared off the Decks and commenced boiling. Latter part Ends With a Strong Breeze and very rough and foggy one Man Sick of Duty

Lat 37° 49' South Long 127° 30' W

Remarks on Board Sunday October 24th 1830

This 24 hours begins With a Strong Breeze and Rugged the Wind to the N. W. and Eastward heading to the N. W. Employing in boiling

Middle part Light Breeze and heavy Weather at day Light We saw a Right Whale Lard got fast and killed and took him along side the Ship and commenced cutting and finished about 11 am

Latter part Ends With a Light Breeze and heavy weather

Lat 37° 40' South Long 127° 41' West

Remarks on Board Monday October 25th 1830

This 24 hours continues With a Light Breeze and thick weather Employing in boiling at 4 pm Saw some Right Whales Lard got fast to two and it on one part and the Whale came off it being clear Knight took the other Whale along side and put the flock home on for the Knight

Middle part Light Breeze and thick foggy Weather at day Light fish bar and began commencing cutting and finished at 10 am Employing in boiling. Latter part Ends With a Strong Breeze and Squally

Remarks on Board Tuesday October 26th 1830

This 24 hours commences With a Strong Breeze and Rugged the Wind to the Eastward heading to the Northward under Short Sail Employing in boiling and Stowing down some of the oil off decks down in the upper hold to make Room for more we began one of the Whales backs in cutting in the East Whales one Man Sick of Duty Middle part the Wind and Weather about same. Latter part Ends Rugged Employing in boiling and Stowing down one Man has but his dog very bad in the blubber room he will be off no use for some time is a fact. Ends this day

Lat 37° 31' South Long 127° 51' West

Remarks on Board Wednesday October 27th 1830

This 24 hours commences With a Strong wind Employing in boiling and Stowing down. Saw one finback Whale Middle part Moderate Breeze and thick foggy Weather Employing in boiling. Latter part the wind hauled round to the N. W. & steering to the Northward and Eastward Employing in boiling and Stowing down the oil after hold some of the oil to End with a Light Breeze and a thick fog and some Squals of Rain. Two Men Sick of Duty. Ends this day

Remarks on Board Thursday October 28th 1830

This 24 hours commences With a Light Breeze from the N. W. steering to the eastward with rain squally Weather Employing in boiling and Stowing down. Middle part Light Breeze and pleasant weather finished boiling at 4 am at day Light We saw a Sail to Eastward at 8 am we commenced Stowing down the oil in the Mains hold. No Whales in Site pursuant to the order of the Sick of Duty. Ends this day

Lat 37° 00' South Long 128° 50' West

Remarks on Board Friday October 29th 1830

This 24 hours commences with a Light Breeze and calm Employing in Stowing down and finished at 4 pm Saw some Right Whales Lard but did not strike for they were to Wild for us at dark came on Board one Sail in Sight

Middle part Light Breeze and calm at 5 am Saw a Right Whale Lard got fast killed and took him to the Ship and commenced cutting and finished at 11 am. Latter part Light Breeze and thick foggy Weather and some Squals of Rain. We have now 3 Men Sick of Duty. Ends this day
