This 24 hours Commences the same at half past 12 O'clock we
 Landed for the Whale and he Went down again for another
 hour and we got fast and Killed and at 4 p. M. we took
 the whole long Side and Got Ready for Cutting for our
 Gun was now Rigged

 sound as
 Light
 was

 Long.

Middle part almost calm

at 6 a. M. we commenced cutting in the Whale and finished
 at 1 p. M. we have seen one thing Remarkable for
 we have taken out of the Bludge of the whale a Board fishes
 Board 1 foot and over it has the appearance of being in the
 Whale for some time previous to the death of the Whale.
 Ends With with pleasant Weather

Remarks on Board Saturday January 22nd 1831

This 24 hours continues with a Light Breeze from the S. E. & blowing
 in Light Employ in taking in the junk and at 1 p. M. we
 kept off N. W. and by 4 p. M. just as we had Bore under Short Sail
 Employ in cleaning of the decks and cutting up the junk.
 at 2 p. M. we commenced Boiling at 7 p. M. we made some
 Sails to get as long to look for more

Middle part Light air

and pleasant we were slight to stem some out of the way so as to Bore

Latter part Ends with pleasant Weather with a fine
 and fair Wind Employ in Boiling With Studing
 Sails Long and a Light Set Nothing in Sight
 but 2 two dolphins

Remarks on Board The Ship Emerald Sunday January 23rd 1831

This 24 hours Commences with Brisk and pleasant Weather Employ
 in Boiling With Studing Sails Set we expect we have the trade wind

Middle part Strong winds and some Squalls of Rain Employ
 in Boiling and Making and taking in Sails as it Required

at 7 a. M. we finished Boiling and cleaned of Decks, the Whale
 Made Between 75. and 80 lbs of oil and one half lbs

Latter part Ends with a Smart Breeze and pleasant

Remarks on Board Monday January 24th 1831

This 24 hours Commences With a fresh Breeze and some Squalls
 of Rain Employ in Ships duty Both in Light at present

Middle part the Wind and Weather Much the same

Latter part pleasant weather Employ in fitting the
 Rigging starting some of the Whiggery soft
 Nothing Remarkable this 24 hours
