Remarks on Board Friday January 18th 1831

This 24 hours continues moderate Breeze and pleasant weather the watch Employers in toring down the Rigging and Sundry Jobs Nothing in Sight

Middle part the wind about the Same with overcast weather

Latter part pleasant weather we have Sent up the Fore and Mizzen Royal Yard and Set the Sail and a Main top Mast Studding Sail & Ends

Remarks on Board Saturday January 19th 1831

This 24 hours continues Like the Last with a Light Breeze and pleasant weather Employers in Ship's duty

Middle part the wind Rather Moderate

Latter part fresh Breeze and pleasant weather Employers in Making Rope for Fore top Sail Breeze & 30 Ends Nothing in Sight

Lat 12.58 South Long 29.32.45

Remarks on Board Sunday January 20th 1831

This 24 hours continues a Moderate Breeze and pleasant weather all Sail Set Employers in Ship's Duty

Middle part the wind hauled to the E. S. E.

Latter part the weather about the Same the wind is E. S. E. Nothing in Sight
