Friday 4 Oct 1833 Those 24 hours calm weather at 4
A.M. Spoke Ship South Carolina (Maxfield) with 1 whale
At 4 P.M. Saw a whale Lowered our Boats
Did not fasten it was a Sulphur Bottom Whale
So ends those 24 hours



Saturday 5 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours calm weather, saw
A number of fin Back Whales, Ship South Carolina off
Weather quarter, so ends those 24 hours

Sunday 6 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours strong breezes at 11
A.M. Spoke ship Norfolk of New Bedford at 4 P.M.
Saw a ship standing Southward so ends those 24 hours

Monday 7 Oct 1833 Those 24 hours strong breezes
At 7 A.M. Lowered our Boats and struck a whale
Irons drew at 1/2 Past 11 Lowered our Boats
And Killed a whale so ends those 24 hours



Tuesday 8 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours strong breezes and
Pleasant weather, all hands employed in boiling oil
At 8 A.M. Saw a ship to windward at 4 P.M. saw a
Right Whale to leeward so ends those 24 hours

Wednesday 9 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours pleasant
Weather at 8 A.M. Lowered our Boats and
Struck a right Whale irons drew and stove
Bow Boat starboard Boat fastened and Killed
the Whale at 4 P.M. Lowered our Boats and Killed
another whale so ends those 24 hours



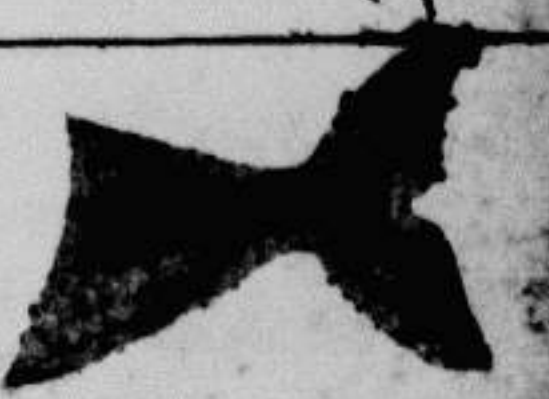
Thursday 10 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours calm weather
Saw a ship off Lee Beam at 4 P.M. Saw a
Right whale, all hands employed in boiling oil
So ends those 24 hours



Friday 11 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours pleasant weather, all
Hands Employed in Boiling and stowing down oil at 1 P.M.
Saw a Ship Standing Northward so ends those 24 hours

Saturday 12 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours pleasant weather,
All hands employed in Boiling and stowing down oil, so
ends those 24 hours

Sunday 13 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours moderate
Breezes all hands employed in stowing down oil at
3 P.M. Lowered our Boats after a right Whale did not
Get fast. Saw 3 Ships off Lee Beam so ends those 24 hours



Monday 14 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours moderate breezes and
Cloudy weather, all hands employed in scraping Whale Bone
At 1 P.M. Saw 2 Ships standing Southward so ends those 24 hours

Tuesday 15 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours pleasant
Weather at 8 P.M. struck a whale irons drew
At 10 A.M. Killed a Whale and sunk him
At 2 P.M. Struck a whale and Killed him so
ends those 24 hours



Wednesday 16th Oct 1833 All those 24 hours
Pleasant weather at 8 A.M. Bow Boat
Struck a Whale irons drew Waste Boat
Fastened and Killed the Whale. Saw a number
of other whales at 4 P.M. Saw 2 Ships to Windward
So ends those 24 hours at 5 P.M. Spoke Ship Norfolk of New
Bedford With 1 Whale also Ship Perseverance of Haver de grace
