

Thursday 17 Oct 1833 Those 24 hours calm and clear weather
 At 6 A.M. Lowered our Boats did not fasten  100
 At 2 P.M. Lowered our Boats and Starboard Boat Killed a whale
 Saw Whales all day in every direction so ends those 24 hours

Friday 18 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours Pleasant weather
 At 7 A.M. Lowered our Boats did not fasten at 10 A.M.
 Lowered our Boats Killed and sunk a right Whale
 At 3 P.M. Lowered our Boats did not get fast at 5
 P.M. Lowered our Boats did not fasten saw a great number of
 Whales all hands employed in Boiling oil so goes those 24 hours

Saturday 19th Oct 1833 Those 24 hours Clear weather and
 Light winds at 10 A.M. Lowered our boats did not fasten
 At 3 P.M. Lowered our Boats waste boat killed a whale
 saw ships Cutting and Boiling in every direction  120
 So goes those 24 hours

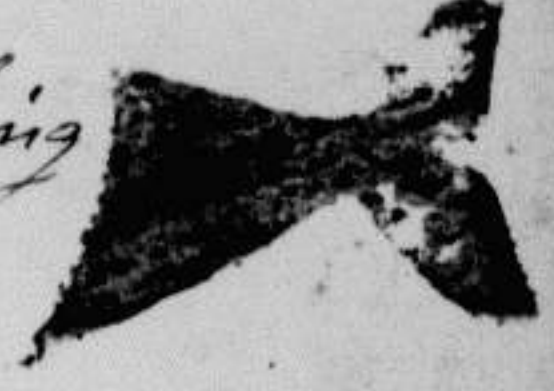
Sunday 20 Oct 1833 Those 24 hours Cloudy and squally weather
 At 10 A.M. Lowered our Boats did not get fast 
 At 2 P.M. Lowered our Boats did not get fast
 At 4 P.M. Lowered our Boats did not get fast
 All hands employed in Boiling and stowing down oil
 Saw whales all day so Ends those 24 hours

Monday 21 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours Cloudy weather
 And light winds Lowered our boats a number
 Of times this day did not get fast saw
 Great number of whales, all hands employed in stowing
 Down oil so end those 24 hours 

Tuesday 22 Oct Those 24 hours pleasant weather this day saw
 Plenty of whales could not get fast all hands employed
 In stowing down oil so ends those 24 hours 

Wednesday 23 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours strong  40
 Breezes this day Lowered our Boats a number of times at
 2 P.M. Killed a Whale and cut him in so ends those 24 hours

Thursday 24 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours light winds
 And Pleasant weather at 6 A.M. Lowered our Boats
 And Killed a whale and sunk another fastend
 To another iron's drew so ends those 24 hours 

Friday 25 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours Strong Breezes and
 Cloudy weather all hands employed in Boiling 
 Oil so ends those 24 hours

Saturday 26 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours Strong breezes
 And Cloudy weather at 10 A.M. Spoke Ship
 Connecticut of New London with 5 right 
 Whales and 2 Spearm at 11 A.M. Lowered our Boats after
 A right whale did not get fast all hands employed
 In scraping Whale Bone and boiling oil so Ends those
 24 hours

Sunday 27 Oct 1833 All Those 24 hours pleasant 
 Breezes and clear weather this day lowered our Boats a number
 Of times could not get fast whales very wild this day 9 ships
 in sight at 4 P.M. Spoke Ships Acasta and Neptune of
 New London with 9 Right and 2 Spearm whales each so
 Ends those 24 hours
