And cloudy weather this day lowered our boats
6 times could not get fast whales very plenty and wild
Saw 9 Ships in sight so ends those 24 hours



Tuesday 29th Oct 1833 Those 24 hours heavy gales of wind and
Cloudy weather at 10 A.M. spoke ship shyluck off Hammer
Off Manchester 20 Days out no oil all saw ship Java of New
Bedford Bailing oil so ends those 24 hours

Wednesday 30 Oct 1833 All those 24 hours heavy gales of wind
Saw to all those 24 hours this day saw 3 ships to Leeward so ends
those 24 hours

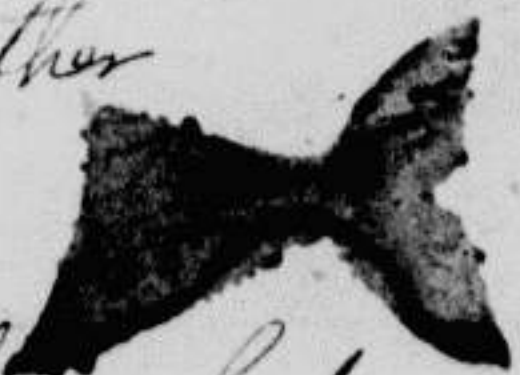
Thursday 31st 1833 All those 24 hours strong Breezes and clear
Weather Lowered our boats after Whales could not
Get fast so ends those 24 hours



Friday 1 Nov 1833 All those 24 hours pleasant gales and clear
Weather at 9 A.M. Killed a Whale to Waste
Boat at 4 P.M. Killed a Whale to Lardon
Boat and Stove Starboard Boat took the whale
Along side at 11 o'clock at night, saw 2 ships to Leeward
so ends those 24 hours

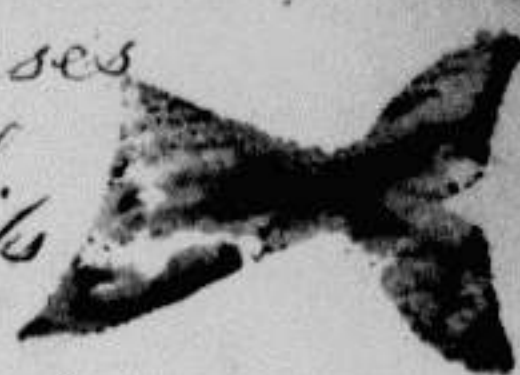


Saturday 2 Nov 1833 Those 24 hours pleasant weather
This day lowered our boats as number of times could
not get fast at 6 A.M. commenced cutting in the whale
Found him to be a dry skin saved only his head and lips so
ends those 24 hours



Sunday 3 Nov 1833 Those 24 hours strong Breezes and cloudy weather
All hands employed in Bailing oil saw 7 ships so ends those
24 hours

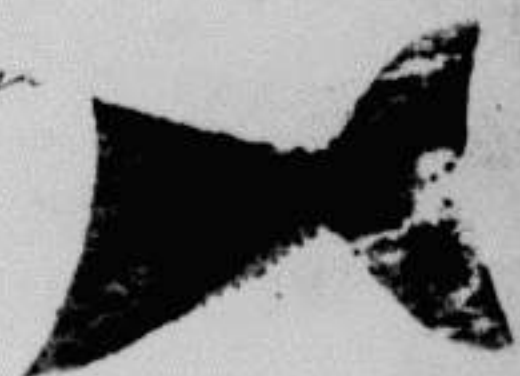
Monday 4 Nov 1833 Those 24 hours strong breezes
All hands employed in drawing down oil saw 3 ships
and 1 at boiling oil so ends those 24 hours



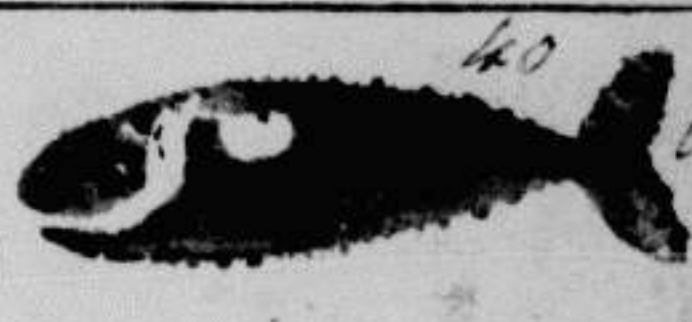
Tuesday 5 Nov 1833 Those 24 hours strong breezes and clear weather
This day Chased whales as number of times could
not get fast saw a number of ships to windward
so ends those 24 hours



Wednesday 6 Nov 1833 All those 24 hours pleasant Breezes latter
Part rainy this day spoke ship Mars of Tag Harbour
1200 barrels ship Chile 10 whales ship Stiffle 5 whales
At 5 P.M. Chased a whale could not get fast ends
those 24 hours



Thursday 7 Nov 1833 Those 24 hours light Breezes
And clear weather at 4 P.M. Killed a whale to Starboard
Boat at 9 A.M. spoke ship two Deaths Stage of New Bedford 7
Whales so ends those 24 hours



Friday 8 Nov 1833 All those 24 hours light Breezes
And pleasant weather at 12 o'clock Killed a whale to
Starboard Boat so ends those 24 hours



Saturday 9 Nov 1833 All those 24 hours light winds and clear weather
This day lowered our boats a number of times could not fasten
Saw 2 ships to Leeward so ends those 24 hours

Sunday 10 Nov 1833 Those 24 hours pleasant weather
At 8 A.M. struck a whale iron drew at 10 A.M.
Saw Boat struck a whale and killed him at 5 P.M.
I Boat killed a whale so ends those 24 hours
