

Saturday 14 Decm 1833 These 24 hours pleasant
Breeces and clear weather all hands employed
In ship duty at 4 Killed 6 Porpoises so ends
These 24 hours

Sunday 15 Decm 1833 These 24 hours strong breezes all hands
Employed in ship duty so ends these 24 hours

Monday 16 Decm 1833 These 24 hours calm breezes and clear weather
This day lowered our boats several times at 2
P.M. Lowered our boats at 6 Killed 2 whales
A Cow Calf sunk the cow and cut from the
Calf so ends these 24 hours



Tuesday 17 Decm 1833 These 24 hours light breezes
At 7 A.M. Kill a whale to the bow boat at
2 P.M. Lower our boats after a gam of whales
All four boats fastened and saved 2 whales
to the Bow Boat and stove the waste Boat so
Ends these 24 hours



Wednesday 18 Decm 1833 These 24 hours strong breezes and foggy
Weather this day cut in 2 Whales all hands employed in
Boiling oil so ends these 24 hours

Thursday 19 Decm 1833 These 24 hours pleasant breezes and
Foggy weather at 2 P.M. saw 2 ships 4 points off our lee Bow
All hands employed in boiling oil and stowing down so ends
These 24 hours

Friday 20 Decm 1833 These 24 hours strong breezes and
Foggy weather at 8 A.M. struck a whale to the starboard
Boat and cut from him so ends these 24 hours



Saturday 21 Decm 1833 These 24 hours all hands employed
In stowing down oil so ends these 24 hours

Sunday 22 Decm 1833 These 24 hours calm
And clear weather at 6 A.M. struck
A whale to S Boat irons drew at 6 1/2 A.M.
Struck and Killed a whale to Waste Boat
At 1/2 past 11 A.M. struck and Killed a whale to S Boat
At 10 A.M. Spoke Ship Rallace, Capt Jasper of Haver with
1200 Barrells oil so ends these 24 hours



Monday 23 Decm 1833 All These 24 hours clear weather
And strong breezes 6 A.M. struck and killed a
Whale to waste boat all hands employed in Boiling and
Stowing down oil saw 2 Sail off our lee bow so ends these
24 hours



Tuesday 24 Decm 1833 All These 24 hours thick weather at 10 A.M.
Spoke ship Flora of New London with 2100 Barrells oil
All hands employed in Boiling and stowing down oil
So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday 25 Decm 1833 All These 24 hours clear weather
And pleasant breezes all hands employed in boiling
And stowing down oil so ends these 24 hours

Thursday 26 Decm 1833 Clear weather and strong breezes
At 2 P.M. Saw a bark Ship showing English Colours stand
Eastward at 6 P.M. Spoke Ship Sally Ann of New Bedford
1400 Barrells oil all hands employed in stowing down oil
This day filled our lower hole so ends these 24 hours

Friday 27 Decm 1833 These 24 hours thick weather and light winds
At 2 P.M. gamd with the Sally Ann off New Bedford so ends
These 24 hours.
