Breeces at 11 AM Made the Island of St Helena at
3 PM hove to. at 1 PM heaved. forward stood in for
the land so ends those 24 hours

Friday 7th Feb 1834 Those 24 hours strong breezes and clear
Weather at 7 AM came to anchor of St Helena also arrived
3 Dutch East India ships 1 English and 1 New York ship
at 10 AM the Harbor Watch went on shore on liberty
to ends those 24 hours

Saturday 8th Feb 1834 Those 24 hours clear weather and pleasant
Breeces this day Harbor Watch on shore on liberty the
Watch on board employed in painting ship so ends those
24 hours

Sunday 9th Feb 1834 Those 24 hours calm breezes and clear
At 4 AM weighed our anchor and sailed for New Bedford
Also sailed ship Marys of St Johns N B with 2200
Bbls oil and a ship for London so ends those 24 hours

Monday 10th Feb 1834 Those 24 hours calm weather and clear
Ship Marys off Harbor quarter all hands employed in ship
Duty

Tuesday 11th Feb 1834 Those 24 hours strong breezes from S E
at 4 PM, came to sail 4 points off our Harbor bow standing
to seaward

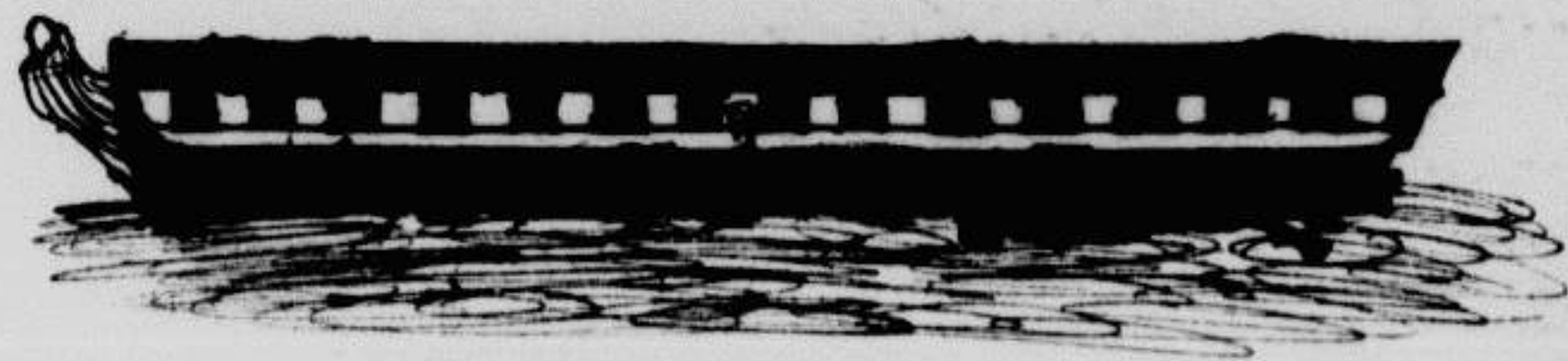
Wednesday

Sunday 22 Feb 1834 Those 24 hours strong breezes and equally
This day crossed the Equinoctial line so ends those 24 hours

Wednesday 25 Feb 1834 Those 24 hours calm weather and raining
This day took the N E Trade winds so ends those 24 hours

Tuesday 18 March 1834 Those 24 hours strong breezes and clear
Weather at 3 AM Made the Island of Long Island at
11 AM took our pilot at 4 PM came to anchor off
New Bedford Light house with 2400 Barrels of Right whale
Oil and 80 Barrels of Sperm was absent from New
Bedford 9 1/2 Months
