

Thursday July 3^d 1834 Those 24 hours commences with
at 3 P.M. Breezes and clear weather at 3 P.M. saw a B.
saw a fin back whale all hands employed in ships duty

Friday July 4 Those 24 hours commence with pleasant
S.W. Breezes and cloudy weather at 12 o'clock took in
top gallant sails reefed top sails at 1 P.M. split
our jip so ends those 24 hours

Saturday July 5 Those 24 hours begin with S.W. gales
this under reefed top sails all hands employed in
ships duty so ends those 24 hours

Sunday July 6th Those 24 hours pleasant gales and clear
weather at 9 A.M. lowered our boats and killed a black
fish to Starboard Boat

Monday July 7 Those 24 hours pleasant weather and
light Breezes all hands employed in ships duty

Tuesday July 8 Those 24 hours commence with strong breeze
and clear weather at 4 A.M. sent down studding sail
Booms took in top gallant sails reefed top sails at 8
A.M. made the Island of Flores one of the western
Islands

Wednesday July 9 Those 24 hours pleasant weather
laying off and on the Island of Flores 2 Boats on shore
so ends those 24 hours

Thursday July 10 Those 24 hours pleasant weather and
variable winds laying off Island of Flores at 4 P.M.
steered for Island of Fuzell at 6 P.M. reefed top sails
so ends those 24 hours

Friday July 11 Those 24 hours pleasant weather at 7 A.M.
made the island of Fuzell at 9 P.M. went on shore
at 7 P.M. steered our course for Cape Deceit Island

Saturday July 12 1834 Those 24 hours light breezes
and calm weather all hands employed in ship duty
so ends those 24 hours

Sunday July 13th 1834 All those 24 hours pleasant gales
and clear weather course S.W. By S. saw a large ship
standing Eastward so ends those 24 hours

Monday 14 July Those 24 hours light breezes and clear weather
at 3 A.M. killed a black fish to Starboard Boat all hands
employed in ship duty so ends those 24 hours

Tuesday 15 July Those 24 hours calm and clear weather
steering S.W. By S. half E. all hands employed in ship duty
so ends those 24 hours

Wednesday 16 July Those 24 hours calm weather and clear
weather steering S.W. all hands employed in ship duty so
ends those 24 hours

Thursday 17 July Those 24 hours light breezes and pleasant
weather steering South all hands employed in ship duty so
ends those 24 hours

Friday 18 July All those 24 hours commence with light
breezes and clear weather at 11 A.M. spoke ship Franklin
and came with her at 4 P.M. saw a sperm whale
to points off us weather how he went down and saw
no more of him

Saturday 19 July All those 24 hours strong breezes and clear
weather at 4 A.M. saw a herm brig steering West so
ends those 24 hours

Sunday 20 July All those 24 hours strong breezes and clear
weather so ends those 24 hours
