

Monday 25 August 1834 Those 24 hours begin with moderate breezes and clear latter part strong breezes. The watch employed in breaking out and stowing down between Decks Course & this day crossed the Equinoctial South Line so ends those 24 hours

Tuesday 26th August Those 24 hours begin with squally weather middle and latter part moderate. All hands employed in sending the cutting pennant aloft and rigging in the flying jib boom. So ends those 24 hours

Wednesday 27 August All those 24 hours pleasant breezes and clear weather all hands employed in overhauling and bending sail Course this day & by 8 so ends those 24 hours

Thursday 28 August all those 24 hours strong breezes and squally weather the watch employed in ship duty

Friday 29 August Those 24 hours strong breezes and cloudy all hands employed in ship duty. Lat 30° 18'

Saturday 30 August Those 24 hours begin with light breezes and cloudy middle and latter part. Raining so ends those 24 hours

Sunday 31 August Those 24 hours begin with calm and cloudy weather latter part the same at 10 P.M. saw a ship 1 point off our weather. Bow

Monday 1 Sept 1834 Those 24 hours begin with light breezes and raining at 7 A.M. saw a ship 1/2 point off our weather. Bow at 6 P.M. Reel'd fore and main top sails took in all three top gallant sails. So ends those 24 hours

Tuesday 2nd Sept Those 24 hours strong breezes and clear weather all hands employed in ship duty

Wednesday 3rd Sept All those 24 hours strong southerly breezes and clear weather at 2 P.M. saw a fin back whale. Course & by 8 so ends those 24 hours Lat 37° 12' S Long 23° 24' West

Thursday 4th Sept All those 24 hours heavy gales of wind and cloudy weather Lat 36° 52' S Long 21° 35' West

Friday 5th Sept All those 24 hours strong breezes and cloudy weather Lat 36° 52' S Long 19° 30' West

Saturday 6th Sept All those 24 hours strong breezes and cloudy Course & by 5 Lat 36° 41' S Long 16° 41'

Sunday 7th Sept pleasant breezes and cloudy Course & at 4 P.M. saw 2 Right Whales. Lat 37° 3' S

Monday 8th Sept All those 24 hours strong breezes and clear weather at 11 P.M. spoke ship Martha of Fairhaven no sail

Tuesday 9th Sept All those 24 hours heavy gales of wind with rain and hail lay to all those 24 hours and in E with ship Martha of Fairhaven 37° 00' S Long 14° 48' West
