Lat 34° 2 South

Friday 12 Sept All those 24 hours strong breezes  
And clear weather Course S.E. in Co. with ship  
Mertha of Fairhaven

Saturday 13 Sept All those 24 hours strong breezes  
And clear weather at 9 AM Made this Island  
Off Tridancunha at 3 PM Spoke Ship Heroine  
Off Fairhaven No oil at 5 PM put away for  
the eastern ground Lat 35.21 S 5.34 West

Sunday 14 Sept 1834 All those 24 hours strong breeze  
And cloudy Course S. so ends those 24 hours  
Lat 35.21 S 1.38 West

Monday 15 Sept All those 24 hours strong westerly  
Winds and squally Course S Lat 34° 48 S.

Tuesday 16th 1834 All those 24 hours strong westerly  
Winds and squally Course S Lat 34° 41 S Long 5.11 E

Wednesday 17th All those 24 hours strong westerly breeze  
And clear Course S.E. Lat 32° 21 S 10.40 E

Thursday 18 Moderate breezes and clear weather  
All hands employed in ship duty Course S  
Lat 31.30 S 10.50 E

Friday 19th Moderate breezes and cloudy weather  
At 10 AM Killed a black fish to land at boat  
Lat 31° 21 S 11° 09 East

Saturday Sept 20th 1834 All those 24 hours  
Clear and calm weather saw a number of fin  
Back whales course E so ends those 24 hours  
Lat 32° 14 Long 11° 31 West East

Sunday Sept 21st 1834 All those 24 hours pleasant weather  
And clear at 4 PM Spoke ship Heave of Harverde goes to  
Months out with 1300 Barrells of oil saw a ship of war  
Quarters so ends those 24 hours Lat 32° 40 Long 10.44 E

Monday Sept 22nd 1834 All those 24 hours pleasant  
Breezes and clear weather at 3 PM Spoke the  
Ship Good Return (Capt) Howland of New  
Bedford no oil so ends those 24 hours  
Lat 32° 21 Long 11° 57 E

Tuesday Sept 23rd 1834 All those 24 hours light  
Wind and clear weather saw a number of fin  
Back whales at 4 PM Spoke ship Islet of salmon  
With 1 Spear and 1 Right Whale so ends  
Lat 32° 36 Long 11° 34 E

Wednesday Sept 24th 1834 All those 24 hours strong  
Breezes and clear weather 4 ships in sight  
so ends those 24 hours Lat 34° 3 Long

Thursday Sept 25th 1834 All those 24 hours pleasant  
Breezes and clear weather saw a large number  
of fin Back whales so ends those 24 hours 10 E  
Lat 33° 10 Long

Friday Sept 26th 1834 All those 24 hours pleasant  
Weather saw 6 ships standing on the wind

Saturday Sept 27th 1834 All those 24 hours clear  
Weather and light breezes at 9 AM Spoke ship  
Fama of Bristol. At 11 AM With 250 Barrells of oil  
At 11 AM Spoke ship Joseph Maxwell of  
New Bedford ship Com Doater 130 Barrells  
Spear oil Lat 31° 58 Long 10.26
