And moderate breezes saw five ships standing
On the wind so ends those 24 hours

Tuesday 30th Sept. All those 24 hours pleasant and
Clear weather saw 4 ships and a number of
Fin Back whales so ends those 24 hours

Wednesday 1 Oct All those 24 hours strong
Breezes and cloudy saw a number of ships
And fin Back whales Lat 32.17 S Long 9.54 E

Thursday 2 Oct All those 24 hours pleasant breezes
And clear weather saw a number of fin
Back whales Lat 31.56 S Long 10.56 E

Friday 3rd Oct All those 24 hours strong breezes
And cloudy weather saw 6 whale ships and
the whales saw a ship show her signal
N.B. Lat 32.19 S Long 9.45 E

Saturday 4 Oct All those 24 hours heavy gales
Off wind and cloudy spoke ship good return (Capt
Howland of New Bedford no oil Lat 32.01 S Long 10.44 E

Sunday 5 Oct All those 24 hours pleasant breeze
And clear weather at 12 M spoke ship Fenelon
Jerney of New Bedford with 1 whale ship
Carrier in sight Lat 32.32 S Long 10.16 E

Monday 6 Oct All those 24 hours calm and clear
Weather at 2 P.M. killed 4 Blackfish so
Good those 24 hours Lat 32.30 S Long 10.20 E

Tuesday 7 Oct All those 24 hours fine breezes and
Clear weather at 4 P.M. spoke ship Good Return
Howland of New Bedford no oil
Lat 31.38 S Long 10.54 E

Wednesday 8th All those 24 hours pleasant
Breezes and clear weather at 4 P.M.
spoke ship Mosenbique Capt Cox of St Johns
N.B. with 2 whales 11 months old at 6 P.M. saw
2 Right whales so ends those 24 hours
Lat 32.18 S Long 11.00 E

Thursday 9th Oct All those 24 hours strong
Breezes and clear weather at 7 A.M. lowered
our Boats after a whale did not get fast at 6 P.M.
spoke ship Triton of Portsmouth Capt Handless
with 5 Bbls oil Lat 32.37 S Long 12.00 E

Friday 10th All those 24 hours calm and clear
Weather at 4 P.M. lowered our Boats
Did not get fast 4 ships in sight
Lat 32.29 S Long 11.16 E

Saturday 11th All those 24 hours calm B 75
And clear weather at 4 P.M.
Struck 2 whales 1 to Starboard 1 to Larboard Boat
At 5 P.M. spoke ship Brant of New Bedford with
1 Spearman and 1 Right Whale
Lat 32.54 S

Sunday 12th Oct All those 24 hours B 80
Strong breezes and cloudy weather
At 12 M killed a right whale and cut him
In All hands employed in Boiling
Oil Lat 33.15 S Long 10.10 E

Monday 13th Oct 1834 All those 24 hours strong breeze
And cloudy this day saw a number of whales
Ship Good Return and Harbor of New Bedford
And Brant with a boiling oil
Lat 33.27 S Long 10.30 E
