

Friday 14th Nov. All those 24 hours strong breezes
and clear weather all hands employed in boiling
oil so ends those 24 hours Lat 33° 20' Long 7° 29'

Saturday 15th Nov. calm and clear all hands
employed in stowing down oil at 9 AM spoke
Ship Judea Kara with 1600 Barrells oil at
12 M struck a whale to Landlord Boat and
took the line so ends those 24 hours
Lat 33° 48' Long 7° 29'

Sunday 16th Nov. strong breezes and cloudy
lowered our boats a number of times could
not get fast all hands employed in scraping
Whale Bone 4 ships in sight
Lat 33° 28' S

Monday 17th Nov. pleasant breezes and clear
weather at 10 AM Killed a whale to
Landlord Boat at 8 AM spoke ship Triton (Tahiti) of
Plymouth Lat 33° 38' S Long 6° 52' E

Tuesday 18th Nov. pleasant breezes and clear
at 9 AM Killed a whale to Bow Boat Stove Bow
And Landlord Boat Saw 3 Ships 1 Ship
Cutting in a whale Lat 33° 50'

Wednesday 19th Nov. 1834 pleasant weather and
calm 2 ships in sight saw one get a whale
At 12 M lowered our boats could not get
fast so ends those 24 hours Lat 34° 05' S Long 5° 16' E

Thursday 20th Nov. 1834 all those 24 hours strong
breezes and clear weather this day put away
for the western whaling ground saw a number
of ships all hands employed in stowing down
oil Lat 35° 04' S Long

Thursday 21 Nov. all those 24 hours strong
breezes and clear weather all hands employed
in scraping whale Bone Course W by S

Friday 22 Nov. 1834 all those 24 hours strong breezes
and foggy lowered our boats a number of times
could not get fast so ends those 24 hours
Lat 35° 08' S Long 00° 39' E

Saturday 23 Nov. 1834 All those 24 hours strong breezes
and foggy Course W by S so ends those 24 hours
Lat 35° 40' S Long 00° 50' E

Sunday 23 Nov. All those 24 hours strong breezes
and clear Course W by S Lat 35° 44' S

Monday 24 All those 24 hours strong breezes and
foggy weather at 9 AM spoke Ship Hope of
New Bedford with 2 Whales so ends those 24
hours Lat 36° 11' S Long 1° 05' W

Tuesday 25 Nov. pleasant breezes and clear
weather at 22 M Killed a whale to Landlord Boat
so ends those 24 hours Lat

Wednesday 26th Nov. pleasant breezes and
clear weather all hands employed in boiling
oil ship Hope of New Bedford got a whale
1 Brig and 1 Ship in sight so ends those
24 hours Lat 37° 20' S Long 3° 43' W

Thursday 27th Nov. 1834 pleasant weather
and light breezes saw 3 Merchant Ships
steering Eastward all hands employed in
stowing down oil lowered our boats a number
of times could not get fast
Lat 36° 35' S Long 3° 33' W
