

Friday 28th Decm 1834 all those 24 hours  strong breezes and foggy at 10 AM struck a whale to the Starboard boat the Iron drew ship Hope in sight so ends those 24 hours Lat 35.43

Saturday 29th Decm 1834 all those 24 hours strong breezes and rain. Curse W. By. et so ends those 24 hours Lat 36.31 Long 1.13

Sunday 30th Decm 1834 all those 24 hours heavy gales and rainy lay to all those 24 hours

Monday 1st Decm 1834 strong breezes and squally. Saw a ship of our sea guard all hands employed in ship duty so ends those 24 hours Lat 35.10 Long 1.30

Tuesday 2nd Decm 1834 calm weather all hands employed in mending sails so ends those 24 hours

Wednesday 3rd Decm 1834 strong breezes and rainy at 2 PM saw a whale bound to Windward so ends those 24 hours

Thursday 4th Decm 1834 those 24  hours begin with strong breezes and rainy at 4 lowered our boats could not get fast at 7 took in sail and hove over ship to at 1 PM made sail at 4 PM killed a whale to Starboard Boat so ends those 24 hours Lat 34.43

Friday 5th Decm 1834 these 24 hours moderate breezes and clear weather all hands employed in Bailing oil Lat 35.00 Long 1.13

Saturday 6th Decm 1834 these 24 hours strong breezes and clear weather all hands employed in bailing oil so ends those 24 hours Lat 35.43

Sunday 7th Decm 1834 these 24 hours  Begin with strong breezes and cloudy At 6 AM lowered our boats after a right whale could not get fast At 8 AM. Roped a school of sperm Whales lowered our boats how that fastened irons drew fastened 2 time And killed the whale Starboard Boat fastened 2 time lost both whales Starboard Boat side and hove our ship to so ends those 24 hours Lat 35.47 Long 1.50

Monday 8th Decm 1834 moderate breezes and clear weather all hands employed in cutting in sperm Whales at 4 PM spoke a French Brig with 400 Bannell's oil so ends those 24 hours Lat 35.50

Tuesday 9th Decm 1834 all hands employed in Boiling sperm oil so ends those 24 hours Lat 36.43 Long 1.00

Wednesday 10th Decm 1834 first part this 24 hours light breezes and fine weather all hands employed in stowing down oil so ends Lat 36.46

Thursday 11th Decm 1834 first part this 24 hours light breezes and fine weather middle and latter part the same all hands employed in Bailing oil at 10 AM killed a whale to Starboard Boat and cut him in 

Friday 12th Decm 1834 first part this 24 hours strong breezes middle and latter part calm all hands employed in bailing oil Lat 36.42 Long 3.05
